What:

The Minority Internship Program is a one semester paid internship that allows full-time junior, senior, and graduate minority students to combine work and learning experience for academic credit.

How:

Interns must work between 30-35 hours per week and attend monthly seminars.

The full-time interns are appointed for a minimum of one academic term and are paid a monthly stipend of \$1000.00.

The MIP program does not give academic credit for the internship experience

Why:

Participants have the opportunity to interact with real decision makers in their respective fields, develop personal interest and expand career opportunities while gaining academic credits.

The program is specifically for African American, Hispanic American, Asian American (or Pacific Islanders), and Native American students.

Who:

- Full time undergraduate and graduate students
- Undergraduates must be at least a junior with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
- Graduates must have a minimum 3.25 GPA or better at the time of application
