New Library Resource

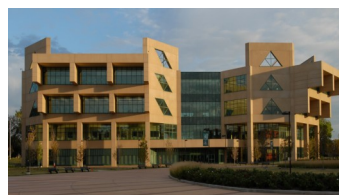
The Ed.D. in Educational Leadership Program has purchased the ProQuest Program titled: *Dissertations and Theses: The Humanities and Social Sciences Collection*.

This resource provides 2.4 million searchable citations to dissertations and theses from 1861 to today, and features 1.2 million full text dissertations from 1997 forward that are available for viewing or downloading.

More than 60,000 new full text dissertations and theses are added to the database each year.

The program is available in the alphabetical list of data-

bases and at other locations on the library's web site.

Doctoral Fellowship Applications Spring 2010

The Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership seeks to develop excellent educational leaders who are well grounded in research and theory in the organizational, sociological, legal, economic, political, philosophical and historical foundations of education. The College of Educa-

tion will award two \$5000 doctoral fellowships for the spring 2010 semester.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for a College of Education Doctoral Fellowship, applicants must:

- A) be currently enrolled in core courses in the Ed.D. program;
- B) submit a letter of intent;
- C) have earned a GPA of 3.5 or better on a 4.0 scale on all doctoral work;

Apply for Spring 2010 fellowship by February 12, 2010.

D) demonstrate commitment to scholarship and service by submitting a research or service project proposal, addressing academic or community needs;

E) be recommended by a current instructor [applicants are responsible for providing recommendation forms to instructors];

F) not have received another doctoral fellowship award.

SELECTION PROCEDURES

Applicants will be evaluated on their commitment to scholarship, academic achievement, leadership, and potential contribution to research or community service.

The two (2) selected fellows are required to present a report of their project status by December, 2010, and a subsequent final report in accordance with the timelines.

Note: Effective year 2009, students can receive the doctoral fellowship award only once.

Students are to submit their proposals to the Ed.D. Program office no later than **5:00 p.m., Friday, February 12, 2010.**

This past fall, the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership Program held an Informational Open House.

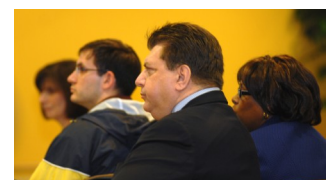
Dr. Watson's inspirational and motivational dialogue challenged the prospective students to pursue the doctoral degree while aspiring

Program Goal

The goal of the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership Program is to prepare students for educational and administrative positions at all levels of management and for professional opportunities associated with higher educational entry and mid-level administrative or research positions.

Program Requirements

The Ed.D. in Educational Leader-

ship Program requires 54 semester hours of coursework including 42 hours of core course work and 12 hours of dissertation research.
