Degree seeking students will receive a Registration Advising Pin (RAP) to register on the web during advisement. • Undergraduate-at-large students will receive their RAP from the Office of the Registrar ADM 128. Graduate-at-large students will receive their RAP from Graduate Studies NAL 234.

2 Register for classes.

Web register at www.csu.edu during web registration dates. See pages 2, 3.

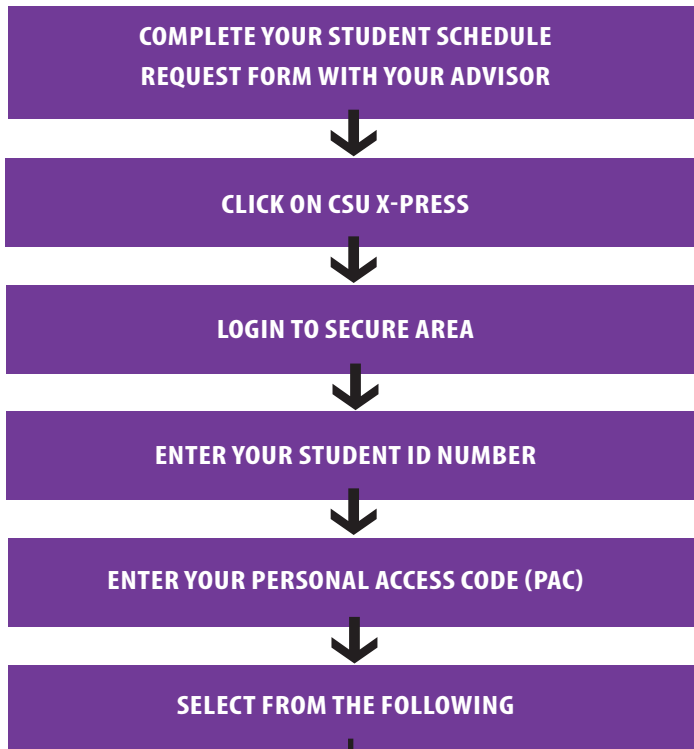
3 Obtain a business receipt from the Cashier (ADM 211) to validate your classes

To validate your classes means that you must get a business receipt from the Cashier. • Your classes will be dropped for non-payment if you do not get a receipt. • NOTE: Students with financial aid, tuition waivers or scholarships must get a waiver from the Financial Aid Office ADM 207. Present this waiver at the Cashier to obtain a business receipt.

4 Obtain or update ID card in NAL 143.

Tips For A Successful Web Registration

- Check your registration status for your registration date.
- If you have all the CRNs for your courses, click on "Add/Drop Classes" even if this is the first time you are registering for the selected term. The system considers each class an "add" even if it is the first class registered for the term.
- You must click on "submit classes" to secure your selections.
- Scroll down to the bottom of the screen to check for registration errors. Your schedule is not final until you have corrected all registration errors.
- You are advised to print your final schedule.
- Changes to course information may be made after the Class Schedule Bulletin is printed. Check CSU X-Press for the most up-to-date course information.

Personal Access Code (PAC)

Your first access to the secure area login requires your USER ID (your University ID number, UID) and your Personal Access Code which is your birth date in the format of (MMDDYY).

Example: May 7, 1950 will be 050750. The system is programmed to request you to immediately change your Personal Access Code (PAC) on your first entry. Your new PAC must be six (6) characters and can be alpha, numeric or a combination. Examples: AZ1234 or 135790 or KLMNOP.

You are also prompted to make up a security question and an answer on your first entry. If you forget your PAC click the "Forgot PAC" button. Keep your PAC confidential and change it if you believe it has been compromised.

Registration Advising Pin (RAP)

To web register you must have a current registration advising pin (RAP). Degree seeking students (undergraduate and graduate) will receive the RAP pin from the academic advisor during the advisement session. New RAPS are assigned each term and expire at the end of the regular registration period.

Computer Locations & Help

You can use your own computer, a local library computer or a computer in CRSU Room 150. CSU X-PRESS registration technical support is available from 9am - 5pm, Monday through Friday at 773-995-2038.

Fee Payment

Your fees must be received by the published deadline dates. If you are paying by check or credit card, please click on on-line payment after you have completed your registration. Students with financial aid awards or other tuition waivers must confirm their registration with a paid receipt at the Cashier Office in ADM-21

Holds

You will not be able to register if there is a hold (academic or financial) placed on your record. Contact the appropriate office prior to your registration to clear your hold. Most offices are not open evenings or weekends.

How to Register

FALL 2008 registration will be done via CSU X-Press only.

Instructions for Registering on the Web STEPS 1-10

1. On the Chicago State University home page, www.csu.edu, click on CSU X- PRESS.
2. Click on Enter Secure area. Scroll down. In the User ID field type your University ID number, UID (or social security number, SSN) and in the PAC field type in your date of birth (mmd-ddy), then click Login. (If you have registered on the web before, enter the PAC you created or click on Forgot PAC to reset your PAC.)
3. Click on Student Services and Financial Aid. Then click on Registration.
4. Click on Term Selection and select correct term i.e., Fall 2008. Click Submit.
5. Click on Add/Drop Classes. You will be prompted to enter an Alternate Pin. Type in the six digit Registration Advising Pin (RAP) number you were given by your advisor.
6. Scroll down. Type in one five digit course reference number (CRN) in each box for each course in which you wish to enroll. After you have typed a CRN for each course, click on Submit Changes.
7. Your courses will appear. Check to see if the subjects, course numbers and sections are correct. If all of the classes you submitted CRNs for do not appear, scroll down for error messages. (Correct time conflicts or closed classes by typing in another section of the course.) (Depending upon the error message, you may have to go back to your advisor for an override.) Click Submit Changes again. Check again to make sure all information is correct and there are no error messages. If no errors, scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on Complete Your Registration. Scroll down to view your charges. Print this page for your records. (If there are no charges on the page, you did not register successfully. Go back to Add/Drop Classes and try again.) Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on Detail Schedule and Print this page for your records also.
8. If you are paying by MasterCard, Visa, Discover or check, you can click on Online Payment to pay your bill, or call the Cashier's Office at (773) 995-2029, to pay by phone.
9. If you are a Financial Aid recipient, or if you have a scholarship or some other form of tuition waiver, you must obtain a waiver from the Financial Aid Office in the Cook Administration Building, room 207, and take the waiver to the Cashier's Window, Cook Administration Building, room 211 to validate (get a receipt) for your registration.
10. If you plan to pay with cash, your payment must be received in the Cashier's Office before the deadline date noted on the web or published in the Class Schedule Bulletin.

Instructions for Dropping Classes on the Web

Follow instructions 1-5 for Registering on the Web (Steps 1-10, left column))On the Add/Drop Classes page, click on the arrow under **Action** next to the course you wish to drop. (The word NONE will be next to the arrow.) Click on Drop Web. Do this for each course you wish to drop. If you wish to add a class to replace the class you are dropping, type in the five digit Course Reference Number (CRN) of the course you wish to add in one of the boxes at the bottom of the screen and click on Submit Changes. Check for error messages. If you have errors, click on Submit Changes again and then type in another CRN. After you have selected your courses with no error messages, click on *Complete Your Registration* at the bottom of the page.

NOTE: You will not be allowed to drop your last class on the web. If you have validated your classes (received a paid receipt) you will have to submit a withdrawal form to the Registrar's Office, Signed by all appropriate parties. If you have not validated your classes, you may call the Registrar's Office at (773) 995-2517 to have your last class dropped.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

Continuing Students

(Those who have attended at least one term since Fall 2006)

Currently enrolled students who have been accepted as candidates for the bachelor's degree will use the Fall RAP (registration advising pin) given at the advisement session to register on the CSU X-Press web registration system. If you must register on-campus, you must present your validated CSU student identification card for Spring 2008 with your advisor-signed student schedule request form in the Registrar's office (ADM 128).

New Students

If you have never attended Chicago State University and you are seeking a degree, you must be admitted (ADM 200). After you have been admitted, you will be advised. Your advisor will give you your Spring RAP (registration advising pin) for use with the CSU X-Press web registration.

Returning Students

Undergraduates who have not attended since the Fall 2006 term and who were in good standing their last term must file an application for readmission (ADM 128) and must submit transcripts covering all college courses completed since withdrawal. **Fall 2008 deadline: August 1.**

Undergraduate students who were dropped from the university, or who were not in good academic standing at the time of withdrawal, should submit to the Office of Admissions (ADM 200) an academic petition form and an application for admission (\$25 fee). Students seeking reinstatement must submit transcripts

covering all college courses completed since withdrawal. The letter of acceptance issued by the Director of Admissions will serve as authorization to register. **Fall 2008 deadline: July 15.**

You must be advised to register. Your advisor will give you your Fall RAP (registration advising pin) for use with the CSU X-Press web registration. See Quick Reference Guide for list of departments.

Undergraduate Students-at-Large

Students may attend the university as “Students-At-Large” in any of the following categories: (1) individuals who are regular students at a regionally accredited college or university and who can demonstrate their good academic standing at their home institution; (2) individuals who are not currently regular students at a regionally accredited college or university but who can demonstrate their good academic standing at the institution last attended; or (3) individuals enrolling at the university as part of a special program or a cooperative agreement between the university and another institution. Students enrolling as Students-At-Large in category one or two who wish to earn more than 30 credits must be admitted as regular students. Students enrolling as Students At-Large in category three will abide by the guidelines established for the program or cooperative agreement. At-large students will receive their registration advising pin (RAP) from the Office of the Registrar. For more information and a Student-At-Large application, contact the Undergraduate Admissions Office, (773) 995-2513.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

Continuing Students

(Those who have attended at least one term since Fall 2006)

MASTER’S DEGREE CANDIDATES

Your graduate advisor will issue your Fall RAP (registration advising pin) in your advisement session for use on the CSU X-Press Web registration system.

GRADUATE STUDENTS-AT-LARGE

If necessary, you will be referred to a department for advisement and course approval. Your registration advising pin (RAP) will be issued by the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School).

New & Returning Students

MASTER’S DEGREE CANDIDATES attending for the first time must be advised. Your advisor will issue your RAP (registration advising pin) for use on the CSU X-Press Web registration system during your advisement session.

NEW STUDENTS-AT-LARGE who are attending for the first time must first report to the School of Graduate & Professional Studies

(Graduate School) Office, New Academic Library, Room 234, to complete a short data form. If necessary, you will be referred to a department for advisement and course approval. Your registration advising pin (RAP) will be issued by the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School).

If you are a Master’s Degree Candidate or a Student-at-Large who has not attended since prior to Fall 2006, an application for readmission must be completed. Forms may be obtained from the Graduate School Office, NAL 234. Master’s Degree candidates must obtain approval signatures for re-entry and for advisement. The Graduate School will approve the registration form for the non-degree (graduate-at-large) student to register via CSU X-Press; restricted courses will require departmental approval, e.g. registering for graduate or higher level course.

PLEASE NOTE: Cooperating teachers eligible for tuition waivers may contact the Office of Field Placement (773)995-2392, Education Building, Room 322. Note that the proper parties must sign the waiver form before Field Placement may issue the waiver. Forms must also be signed in the Provost (Cook Adm Bldg, Rm. 306) and Financial Aid (Cook Adm Bldg, Rm. 207) offices and submitted to the cashier (Cook Adm Bldg, Rm. 211) for proper validation.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

If you plan to enroll for courses to achieve initial teacher certification and you have been evaluated by the Chicago Board of Education or the State of Illinois, please present your Deficiency Statement at the College of Education Teacher Certification Office, (773) 995-2519, Education Building, Room 208. All College of Education requirements for entry to teacher certification sequences must be met and appropriate departmental signatures obtained prior to enrolling in certification courses.

UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES

Civil Service Staff

If you are a Civil Service employee enrolled in an undergraduate program, and intend to pay for tuition with a Civil Service Waiver, please be informed that you may be eligible for financial aid. Please complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid to the U.S. Department of Education, and complete the financial aid application process.

If you need assistance completing the financial aid documents call (773)995-2371 or contact the Educational Opportunity Center, located in the Douglas Hall, Room 132. In order to take tuition-free courses, the “Application for Civil Service Employee Education Benefits” must be completed, approved by your supervisor, and sent to the Department of Human Resources, ADM 203. Applications are available in ADM 203.

Civil Service employees are under the same academic regulations as other students at the university. All university employees not possessing a bachelor’s degree are limited to a maximum of thirty (30) semester hours of course work prior to their formal admission to the university.

Faculty and Administrators

In order to take tuition-free courses, employees must receive written approval from their chairperson or supervisor and college dean, where appropriate, indicating the course(s) for enrollment. The written approval then must be submitted to the Provost, ADM 306. The program identification code for faculty and administrators not seeking a degree is GSAL. All university employees are subject to the rules and regulations set forth by Chicago State University in regards to education benefits for employees.

Advisement

All degree-seeking students are REQUIRED to be advised prior to their registration. Advisors will give the RAP (registration advising pin) to a student after the advisement session to use with the CSU X-Press web registration system.

Special undergraduate Students at-Large (USAL) do not need advisement and their RAP (registration advising pin) will be issued by the Registrar's office. Master's degree candidates and graduate certificate students must be advised by the department supervising the program to which they have been admitted. RAP (registration advising pin) numbers are distributed by graduate advisors.

Graduate-At-Large Students (GSAL, GSUM) must obtain their RAP (registration advising pin) numbers or course approval from the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School - NAL 234) prior to attempting to register. However, special permission is required for at-large students to enroll in any 5000-level or higher graduate course. Students registering by web must obtain academic departmental approval prior to attempting to register for these or any other restricted course. Students should not attempt to register for two different sections of the same course. If additional work is desired in a variable credit course, please talk with the department chairperson.

Student Registration Responsibility

It is the responsibility of each student to enter the proper course reference number for all registration transactions. A student should only register for advised courses. Abuse of the web registration system will result in the inability to use the system in the future. You are responsible for obtaining a receipt for payment on your account by the published payment due dates, even if your account is being paid through a grant, scholarship, loan or another party. You must confirm your registration with a paid receipt from the Cashier's Office (ADM 211).

If an admitted student presents unofficial transcripts as a basis for advising, the student is responsible for any consequences related to course selection, registration and academic progress based upon the unofficial transcripts.

Drop a Course(s)

A student can drop a course(s) after the late change of program period on CSU X-Press until Monday, September 8, 2008. After September 8, students must receive the advisor's approval for dropped course(s) on their Change of Program form. Withdrawal from a course(s) is not complete until the form is submitted to the registrar's Office (ADM 128) and approved by a Records and Registration staff member. Errors in the completion of Change of Program form are the student's responsibility.

NOTE: Students who reduce their credit hour load below 12 semester hours by September 8 are eligible for a partial refund.

F-1 international students are REQUIRED to receive authorization from the Office of International Program's designated school official BEFORE dropping a course which will reduce the F-1 student's credit hour load below 12 semester hours.

Academic Regulations

ACADEMIC PROGRESSION POLICY

Students who have not successfully completed the academic skills requirements will have a hold(s) placed on their records which will remain until the specified requirements have been met.

Academic Skills Courses & Placement Assessment

English and Reading / Once accepted for admission to Chicago State University, all freshmen and/or transfer students must take the university diagnostic examinations in English and Reading by the end of their first term in residence. All students must either meet their minimal requirements of the university diagnostic examinations in English and Reading or pass the appropriate academic skills course, namely, English 1230/123 or 1240/124, or Reading 1500/150. Students placing into an academic skills course in English or reading must enroll in the appropriate course the semester immediately following the examination. To exit from these courses, students must pass the appropriate examination.

Math / Effective Fall 2007

Degree seeking undergraduate students may not register for any mathematics or computer science courses until they have passed the mathematics qualifying examination or the appropriate academic skills mathematics course(s). This is a computerized examination which will place students into MATH 0880/088 (Math Tutorial), 0990/099 Level I or 0990/099 Level 2 (Intermediate Algebra) or a higher-level mathematics course depending on the student's major.

Transfer students who transfer in one or two general education math courses with a C or better and whose majors do not require additional math courses do not have to take the placement examinations in mathematics. Students must meet with their advisors to determine whether or not their majors require them to take the mathematics placement examination. Regardless of major, any student who wishes to enroll in a course or courses for which passing the Math 0990/099 level of the diagnostic math examination is required as a prerequisite must take the examination and enroll in Math 0880/088 or 0990/099 Levels I or II as advised based on the mathematics examination results.

Math 0990 has the following general characteristics: (a) based on a computer platform that actively helps students develop the skills of self-monitoring and reflection, and allows individuals to proceed at a faster pace; (b) utilizes students' preexisting knowledge; (c) emphasizes acquiring computational skills and understanding of concepts; (d) uses graduate and undergraduate assistants as in-class tutors; (e) accommodates the students' various levels of preparedness; (f) prepares students for Math 1800/123, 1010/140, 1200/162, CPTR 1100/141, etc. with Math 1800/123 being the general education course of choice for non-science majors; and (g) revises the curriculum to address math as needed in the majors.

DESCRIPTION / Math 0990 is an eight credit course comprised of two levels of four credits per level: Level 1 and Level 2. The current upper-end of 090 and lower half of 095 have been merged into Math 0990 Level 1; the upper end of 095 and material from 098 have formed Math 0990 Level 2. Thus, students needing only Level 2 will enroll in 4 credits only; students needing both levels will enroll in eight credits. The placement exam will determine a student's level. Half a semester or eight weeks is devoted to each level.

Cancelled Classes

The university reserves the right to limit the size of the classes and to cancel classes for which there is insufficient enrollment. If the class for which you are registered is cancelled, you will automatically be dropped from the class. If you do not find an alternative class, a tuition refund will be processed to your account according to the refund policy. Students receiving financial aid may wish to consult with their financial aid counselor concerning any award implications.

Class Attendance

Students are expected to attend all class sessions in the course sections for which they are registered unless prevented by illness, an official university activity, or other urgent and unavoidable reasons. The responsibility for maintaining class attendance records rests with each faculty member. Students are expected to make their own arrangements with faculty members regarding making up class work and all assignments when classes are missed.

The following is the university policy on class attendance:

- An instructor may drop students who do not attend the first day of class and make no attempt to contact the instructor or department chairperson prior to the absence. The instructor may report students who do not attend the first two weeks of class without evidence of a legitimate excuse to the Registrar who will drop the student from the class.
- Instructors are required to monitor and keep records of the attendance of students at all class meetings. If a student's total absences are equal to or exceed the equivalent of two weeks of instruction, the instructor may drop the student from the course with a grade of W by September 24. The instructor may assign a nonattendance grade of W/A or W/N. (See WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY)
- To drop or withdraw from courses, the student must use the drop/withdrawal form, have an advisor sign it, and then submit the form to the Registrar's office. If a student stops attending a class but fails to withdraw officially from the class before the official drop date, the result may be a failing grade. Although the instructor may drop a student for nonattendance, it is ultimately the student's responsibility to drop the class. (See WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY).

If you are attending a class and you are informed that your name does not appear on the official preliminary and subsequent class rosters, it is your responsibility to investigate the matter immediately by contacting the Office of Records and Registration.

Graduate Students - Graduate students-at-large may enroll in Masters level courses by obtaining permission from the academic department supervising the course prior to attempting to register for these courses. Restrictions or safeguards are built into the registration system that prevent registration in these courses by students-at-large. Students at-large who wish to enroll for Masters courses should first check with department graduate advisors or chairpersons to have these restrictions lifted prior to registration.

Credit Hour load

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS -The maximum credit hour load for the Fall semester is 16 credit hours. This includes all day session courses, evening courses; extension courses and courses taken elsewhere. Students whose CSU cumulative grade point average is 3.0 or better may register for a program of eighteen (18) semester hours. Additional hours beyond sixteen (16) must be approved by the department, and then the Registrar's Office must put the approval in the system.

Students who have a cumulative CSU grade point average of 1.99 or less are limited to a maximum of 12 credit hours or four courses. Although there is no minimum credit hour load for students, the following minimum credit hour loads are recommended: Veterans receiving benefits under Public Law 89-358 "Veterans Re-adjustments Benefits Act of 1966," must carry 12 credit hours to be eligible for full subsistence allowances during the Spring semester. Students may not be registered at other colleges without written permission from the Academic Evaluation and Advisement Office, ADM 128. This permission MUST be obtained prior to registration at either college.

F-1 INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS must carry a minimum 12 hours during Fall and Spring terms to maintain lawful F-1 student status in the United States.

GRADUATE STUDENTS – A full-time academic load of graduate courses is nine (9) hours in the Fall semester. Exceptions to the graduate course credit hour load may be made with the approval of the graduate faculty advisor and/or the department chairperson and the Graduate Dean. Students may not be registered at other colleges and universities without approval of their advisor and the Graduate Dean. Permission must be obtained prior to registration at either college.

Placement Assessment (ADM 126)

Students must have a picture ID to take the placement assessment. The assessment placement schedule is posted in the office as well as on the Examination office web site.

Prerequisites (+)

Prerequisites are listed in the university catalog or on CSU's web site at www.csu.edu/catalogs. A student should not attempt to register for a course unless she/he meets the prerequisites, if any, for the course. If a student does not meet the prerequisite for a course, the student may be dropped from the course. Please consult with your academic advisor about prerequisites for your courses.

Undergraduate Repeat Policy

Students are allowed to repeat a course and have the highest grade earned count toward the cumulative grade point average. Please note that certain financial aid programs may not cover tuition toward repeating a course. Students should contact a financial aid advisor when attempting to repeat a course to determine eligibility.

Withdrawal from the University

Students who withdraw from the university by September 8 are eligible for a total refund of all mandatory fees. Students are permitted to withdraw from the university until Wednesday, September 24 upon completing a Change of Program/Withdrawal form. Students who withdraw from the university during the period beginning September 8 and ending September 24 are eligible for a 50% refund of the eligible tuition and fees. No refunds will be issued after this date if a student withdraws from the university. Students must receive the approval of the advisor, Bursar, and the Financial Aid Office for the course(s) withdrawn during this period on their Change of Program/Withdrawal form. A withdrawal from the university is not complete until the Change of Program/Withdrawal form is submitted and approved by a Records and Registration staff member. Errors in the completion of the Change of Program/Withdrawal form are the student's responsibility.

Students can request to drop or withdraw from a course after the submission of midterm grades until Friday, November 14, 2008 with the instructor's signature. The form must have the instructor's signature, student's signature, and the grade of W/P or W/F must

be circled by the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to submit the signed form to the Office of the Registrar, ADM 128, no later than Friday, November 14, 2008. **Forms submitted after Friday, November 14, 2008. will not be accepted.**

Students can also request to be totally withdrawn from the university prior to the final exam period. Each instructor must sign the Post Mid-Term Drop form in the space for written permission and circle the grade of W/P or W/F. It is the student's responsibility to submit the signed form to the Office of the Registrar no later than Monday, December 1, 2008 before the onset of final exams. Grades of either W/P or W/F will appear on the final grade sheet for students who have requested a total withdrawal prior to the final exam period.

Students who do not opt to drop or withdraw after midterm or request a total withdrawal for the semester prior to final exams will receive grades of A, B, C, D, I, P, or F as final grades.

Directory Information

Chicago State University, in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, has designated the degrees a student has been awarded, current enrollment status (full-time/part-time, withdrawal) and academic information used to determine eligibility for scholarships or awards as directory (public) information. The University receives many inquiries for directory information from a variety of sources including prospective employers, licensing agencies, government agencies, friends, and relatives.

Students have the right to have this directory information withheld from the public if they so desire. Forms to request directory information be withheld can be obtained in the Office of the Registrar (ADM 128). The University, in good faith, will not release information not listed as directory information unless the student provides written consent for the release.

Distance Learning (NAL 428)

Technical requirements / Access to a personal computer with Windows (2000, ME, XP); Microsoft Office 2003 (Word, Excel and Power Point); Pentium 4 or faster processor; at least 512 megabytes of memory (RAM) and a 56K modem with internet access. Broadband is preferable. Microsoft Vista and Office 2007 are not supported by BlackBoard at this time.

Distance Learning Courses / A **web or online course** is a course that is led by an instructor using a web browser to access a course management system for synchronous and asynchronous instruction and assessment. Some examinations may be proctored and must be taken on campus or at another mutually agreed upon location. A **hybrid course** is a course led by an instructor using a web browser to access a course management system for asynchronous instruction where some course sessions are scheduled on campus or at another designated location as listed in the comments below the course listing.

Registration Requirements / During or before registration students MUST consult with an advisor regarding admittance to WEB and HYBRID courses. You MUST also have some experience with navigating the Internet and using it as research tool and communication resource.

Also, you can access CSU X-Press to obtain and print a copy of your class schedule. No copies will be printed in the Office of the Registrar. If you need official verification of your attendance or academic record, you may submit a verification or transcript request in the Registrar's Office, Cook Administration Building, Room 128. Remember, you will not be able to receive a copy of your grades by mail. If you need assistance in using CSU X-Press, please stop by the Office of the Registrar, or call (773) 995-2038.

Graduation Applications

BACHELOR'S DEGREE CANDIDATES may pick up an application and submit to your advisor by Monday, September 8, 2008. The deadline for filing your advisor signed application for Fall 2008 in the Office of Evaluation & Advisement (ADM 128) is Monday, September 15, 2008.

MASTER'S DEGREE CANDIDATES may obtain applications for a degree audit (graduation) from the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School) Office, New Academic Library Room 234, or by calling (773)995-2404. (No cash payments are accepted in the Graduate School office). Signatures are required for all students. Students obtaining certification with their program must obtain the departmental stamp from the Office of Teacher Certification (ED 208) as well. The deadline for filing your Fall 2008 graduation application is Monday, September 15, 2008.

Immunization Requirement

Illinois Public Health Act Administrative Code Part 694 specifies that any student born on or after January 1, 1957, who is enrolled, a first time freshman, a transfer student or reentering the university after an absence of more than one semester, will be required to show proof of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria and tetanus prior to registration. Evidence of immunity from these diseases is required for students. A registered health care provider must verify documentation of immunization and testing. A high school health record with proof of immunization, if properly noted and certified, is acceptable documentation for residents of Illinois. Individuals who are not properly immunized will not be allowed to register. Proof of proper immunization must be on file prior to registration.

Evidence of tuberculin testing is required for all international and residence hall students, as well as students in programs which require proof of immunizations (e.g., health programs and education).

Students who need to obtain immunizations or information regarding immunizations may contact their primary care provider or their local public health clinic. Students who reside outside the city of Chicago should contact the public health clinic of their township or county.

Students who wish to prove immunization requirements must complete the Student Immunization form and send it to: Wellness/Health Center, Chicago State University, 9501 S. King Drive/ADM 131, Chicago, Illinois 60628. Students can call the Wellness Center at (773) 995-2010.

Students who fail to comply with the immunization requirements will be assessed a \$25.00 non-compliance fee.

Parking

Individuals using the university parking facilities must use a key card for entry/exit or pay \$4 per entry at the parking lot entrance.

Student Identification Card Policy

All full-time and part-time students enrolled at Chicago State University are required to obtain an official CSU photo identification card. The card should be kept in their possession while on campus or attending functions and classes at CSU. A valid CSU I.D. card is required to use all university facilities,

including the library and the computer center. In addition, it is required to obtain free or reduced admission to university events. This card must be presented on demand for the purposes of official university identification.

Transcripts/Enrollment Verifications

All transcripts (\$5 per copy by mail; \$7.50 via the web) and written enrollment verifications (\$4) per copy except for governmental agencies) are mailed. A pickup service is not available. No fee will be charged for enrollment verifications issued to: Public Aid / Department of Human Services; federal government agencies; banks; child care services and subsidized housing services.

Validation

What is validation?

What does validation do for a student?

- Validation locks students into their classes so that they will not be dropped unless the student or instructor does so.
- Every student should do a formal withdrawal if the student is not going to attend the University.
- If you have already validated with cash, check, charge, third party letter or a financial aid waiver, your class(es) will not be dropped. If you make a payment to your account for parking, library fines, meal plans, or any other items for the current term, your classes for that term will not be dropped.

Mandatory fees apply to all on-campus students with combination off-campus and on-campus schedules regardless of student level or residency.

Four Year Guaranteed Tuition Plan

The "Truth in Tuition" bill mandates that Illinois public universities provide four years of level tuition for new students enrolling for the first time beginning with the Fall 2004-2005 academic year. Undergraduate and transfer students enrolling at CSU for the first time after Fall 2004 and students who enroll for the first time every semester beginning Fall 2004-2005 and thereafter will have their tuition rate held constant for four consecutive years.

The guaranteed rates will remain in effect for four years or until the student reaches 120 credit hours. The hours will be extended to accommodate any majors or programs that exceed the 120 hours or four years. The guaranteed rate will remain in effect except in the event of a break in enrollment of no more than one year (two semesters, excluding summer school). In no case will the initial guaranteed rate be valid beyond five years of total enrollment. A tuition surcharge of 10% will be assessed for students that extend beyond the four-year guarantee period (120 credit hours) or five years of total enrollment. For all other students, CSU's current tuition program will remain in effect.

IMPORTANT! NOTE: A change in major will not affect the guaranteed rate. The guaranteed rate will continue for the number of credit hours necessary to complete the new major, not to exceed five years of total enrollment. Beyond five years of total enrollment, a 10% surcharge will be assessed.

Extended illness and military service will be given special consideration. The rate guarantee will be extended on a case-by-case basis by invoking the student appeal process.

Transfer student rates will be guaranteed based upon 120 credit hours less the number of credits transferred at the time of first enrollment. All extensions and exceptions that apply to new freshmen will be extended to new transfer students.

Credit Hour Pricing / Beginning with the Fall 2004-2005 academic year, tuition and mandatory fees will be charged on a per credit hour basis up to 15 hours. This 15 credit hour cap will allow students to complete 120 credit hours in eight semesters or four years. Credit hours above 15 will be charged at the rate for 15 credit hours.

Out-of-State Undergraduate Tuition / Undergraduate out-of-state (non- Illinois resident) per credit hour tuition is twice the resident per credit hour tuition. The Four Year Guaranteed Tuition Plan is extended to all undergraduate out-of-state new freshmen and transfer students.

Out-of-State Graduate Tuition Rates / Graduate out-of-state (non-Illinois resident) per credit hour tuition is twice the resident per credit hour tuition.

Payment and Reund Policy

No registration transaction is complete until the Business Office has processed the transaction and the student has been issued a printed receipt. If you web register, please confirm your registration by receiving a paid receipt for your Fall registration at the cashier's office. All students registering for Fall must get a receipt for their first installment.

1. **Students who have outstanding debts** at Chicago State University will not be permitted to register until such debts have been paid.
2. **Discover, Master Card, Telecheck, VISA, cash,** money orders, cashier's checks, certified checks, personal checks and traveler's checks will be accepted for payment of tuition and fee charges. In addition to accepting payment by personal check, ECAP provides electronic check approval that takes funds from your checking account within 48 hours of the time the check is written to CSU. Business checks will not be accepted.
3. **Students who have presented two NSF** (not sufficient funds) checks to the university, even though restitution has been made, will be required to pay for their registration with cash, money orders, certified checks, traveler's checks, Master Card, VISA or Discover. Business checks will not be accepted.

5. Installment Payment Option

- A. ELIGIBLE:** All Illinois resident students registering for six (6) or more hours during advance, regular and late registration.
- B. NON-ELIGIBLE:** Students who have tuition and fee charges that amount to less than the required deposit due to financial aid credits are not eligible. Students registering for less than six (6) hours are not eligible.
- C. TUITION MANAGEMENT INSTALLMENT PLAN:** Chicago State University offers an interest-free monthly payment plan to spread your education expenses over time instead of one large payment. For more information, or to enroll, call 1-800-722-4867 (TMS/ 24 hours a day) and speak with an education payment counselor or log on to www.csu.edu/. Or, you can log on directly to Tuition Management Systems at www.afford.com. Only students enrolling for three (3) credit hours or more are allowed to use the Tuition Management Installment Plan. Students using the installment payment option are required to make an initial payment at the time of registration or by the payment deadline date of September 11, 2008. Please remember your initial deposit must go to Chicago State or your registration will be cancelled. The enrollment fee for using the installment plan varies according to the number of payments in your plan. Whether you are on the installment plan with TMS or not, you will still pay the deferred fee amount if tuition is not paid in full at the time of registration. The deferred fee is non-refundable.

Pay On-Line via the WEB!

Now you can register and pay your bill online via the web! Log on to www.csu.edu, then click on CSU X-Press, enter the secure area to get to the log in prompt. Once you get there, key in your social security number and your PAC number. Click login and at the next prompt click on Student Services and Financial Aid. Then click on Student Records. Click on On-Line Payments.

1. Refunds

The service fee is nonrefundable; the down payment is refundable in accordance with the University Refund Policy. Selecting the installment payment option can not extend the refund period. Final payment is due on withdrawals after the refund period.

2. Final Payment

Partial or complete payment will be accepted at any time; however, the total balance must be paid according to your TMS payment plan to avoid any additional charges. Final payment is due November 5, 2008.

3. Default

Failure to make a complete payment on time: failure to make payment according to your payment plan will cause payment default and a \$25 delinquent fee will be assessed each semester that the balance is outstanding. In addition, a hold will be placed on your academic record and you will not be permitted to register for subsequent terms until the balance is paid in full.

4. Your Money Responsibilities

In the event of your failure to meet the terms of your installment payment agreement, you will not be eligible for academic credit for enrolled courses. In addition, Chicago State University may report your account to the credit bureau, place your student account with an outside collection agency and assign the account to the State of Illinois Off-Set System. It is further understood that all reasonable collection costs, fees or legal expenses incurred by Chicago State University and any outside agency in securing payment is your responsibility. These fees could range from 25% to 50% of your unpaid balance.

NOTE: Chicago State University is under no obligation to send individual bills to students. Reminder notices will be placed in university publications.

Refund Policy

- 1. Partial refund** (less than 12 hours): A partial reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made to the accounts of students who reduce their credit hour load below 12 semester hours during the period beginning August 25, 2008 and ending September 8, 2008.
- 2. 100% refund** upon complete withdrawal: A total reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made upon complete formal withdrawal from the university during the period beginning August 25, 2008 and ending September 8, 2008.
- 3. 50% refund** upon complete withdrawal: A 50% reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made upon complete formal withdrawal from the university during the period beginning September 9, 2008 and ending September 22, 2008.

NOTE: Actual refund amount may vary depending on factors such as deferred payment option and financial aid award reductions. Refund checks are mailed. Please allow four to six weeks for processing from the final refund date (September 22, 2008).

Policy on Returned Checks

All checks are processed through Telecheck. Any returned check will require a \$20 Chicago State University return check fee and a \$25 fee payable to Telecheck for a total of \$45. If you reimburse Chicago State University directly for any check you will still be assessed the \$25 fee by Telecheck, and an additional \$25 delinquent payment fee by Chicago State University.

It is the responsibility of the student to maintain a current address in the Records Office.

NOTE: All dates, fees, and charges are subject to change without notice.

Student Health Insurance

CRSU 247 • (773) 995-4533

Students (with 12 hours or more) are automatically billed and enrolled in the mandatory health plan. Students have the option of waiving before the September 12, 2008 deadline if they have equal or better coverage. The basic Student Health Plan for accident and sickness is mandatory for students, undergraduate and graduate, who enroll with 12 hours or more. The fee applies to all on-campus semester hours and students with a combination of off-campus semester hours and on-campus semester hours.

Students are automatically charged a fee for student health insurance on their tuition accounts through the Bursar's office when the enrolled hours become 12 or more. The Fall 2008 Health Insurance cost per student is \$460.00. There is an additional cost to insure dependents. Please contact the Student Health Insurance office for more information at (773) 995-4533.

Coverage Period

Students enrolled in the insurance plan for the Fall 2008 semester will receive coverage until the beginning of the Spring 2009 semester.

Part-time students now eligible for coverage

Part-time students (enrolled in 6-11 credit hours) will be allowed to enroll in the Student Health Insurance Plan on a voluntary enrollment basis. Part-time students must enroll before September 12, 2008.

Cancellation Requirements

A cancellation form must be submitted every semester a student enrolls in 12 credit hours or more. Students with equal or better coverage may apply for cancellation of the mandatory fee before the September 12, 2008 deadline. A copy of insurance card and ID must accompany cancellation form. The cancellation forms are available during registration or may be obtained from the Office of Student Health Insurance (CRSU 268) before the Fall deadline.

NOTE: Don't wait until you receive a bill with the insurance charge itemized, or you may miss the deadline to cancel. Cancellation requests are not accepted after the cancellation deadline of September 12, 2008. Students insured under the plan will receive their ID cards by mail. Please make sure a current address is on file with the Registrar's Office.

Student Financial Aid

Deadlines and policies are available in the Office of Financial Aid, Office of Student Financial Aid and on the Financial Aid website. The university provides an established financial assistance program designed to best meet the needs of Chicago State University students. Assistance is available to eligible students in the form of scholarships, grants, assistantships, student employment and loans. All students wishing to be considered for financial assistance must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

To be eligible for Federal Grants

Students must be enrolled in a program leading to a degree/certificate in order to be eligible for Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants, Federal College Work-Study, Federal Stafford Student Loans, Federal Perkins Loan and the Illinois Student Assistance Commission MAP Grant.

Special students (At-Large, conditionally admitted Graduate students, or students enrolled in contract courses) are not eligible for state or federal financial assistance. Generally, students must be enrolled for at least six (6) credit hours in order to be eligible for assistance from these programs.

Undergraduate students must be enrolled for at least nine (9) hours in order to be considered three-quarter time and twelve (12) or more hours in order to be considered full time. Nine hours is considered full time for Master's candidates; six (6) hours part-time. A change in enrollment status (hours enrolled and/or grade level) that occurs after the financial aid recipient's original registration must be reported immediately in writing to the Office of Student Financial Aid. Failure to report changes in enrollment status may result in an overpayment, cancellation of benefits, and jeopardize future eligibility for student financial assistance. Students selected for verification by the U.S. Department of Education or the university will be required to provide requested documentation before their financial aid awards can be processed.

Review your Financial Aid status anytime

Students may review their financial aid status at any time on the CSU X-Press website. This website provides students with information relating to the amount of their financial aid awards, if any, as well as informing them of any requirements that they might need to fulfill, such as, but not limited to, submitting verification documents, tax forms, SAP (Satisfactory Academic Progress) petitions, etc., before their financial aid package may be finalized.

The Office of Student Financial Aid no longer mails document tracking and award letters to continuing students. Instead, students are notified via e-mail that there is "activity" on their financial aid accounts and that they should go to the CSU X-Press website

to review their status. All continuing CSU students have been assigned an email account. It is every student's responsibility to access his/her email periodically and to review any communication from the Office of Student Financial Aid.

Financial Aid Waivers

A limited number of "temporary financial aid waivers" may be issued to students that have submitted all accurate financial aid documentation: accurate and signed Student Aid Report, income documentation, as well as additional documentation requested by the Office of Student Financial Aid prior to the academic term. Waivers are issued through the Office of Student Financial Aid and are contingent upon pending financial aid, enrollment status, and academic progress standards. Students are responsible for payment in the event that funds are not received due to program limitations.

Student Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress

Policy and procedures

Federal and State regulations require Chicago State University to establish and implement a "Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy" for students. Chicago State University's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy measures whether eligible undergraduate/graduate students are progressing at a reasonable rate towards the completion of their educational objectives. Students must be in compliance with this policy in order to maintain their continued financial aid eligibility. Copies of the current Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy are available for students in the Office of Student Financial Aid. The document is also available for review in both the undergraduate and graduate catalog, as well as on the Chicago State University website.

Mitigating Circumstances/Appeal Process

Students who fail to make satisfactory academic progress may petition for reinstatement of their eligibility to the Satisfactory Academic Progress Appeals Committee. The student must document mitigating circumstances, such as injury, illness, family death or other emergencies. Students appealing for reinstatement of their financial aid eligibility will be required to seek assistance from the many academic support services offered by the university. Students whose appeals are denied will be required to sit out financial aid for one semester. In that semester they must: a) fulfill stipulations of a NEW contract and b) attain a minimum semester G.P.A. as specified and c) successfully meet requirements of the quantitative measure. Students who have fulfilled all of the above requirements can apply for probationary financial aid status. If granted, they must spend a semester on financial aid probation. To exit this probation, they must fulfill requirements specified under "Exiting Probation." Students who are terminated from financial aid eligibility and subsequently reinstated are considered to be in probationary status.

NOTE: The Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy is subject to change without notice. The Office of Student Financial Aid will make every attempt to provide students with timely notice regarding their satisfactory academic progress status. However, it is every student's responsibility to read the policy and monitor his/her own progress.

ISAC Monetary Award Limitations

The State of Illinois MAP grants, which are administered by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC), are being tracked by the equivalent number of semester hours of MAP benefits paid on a student's behalf. This is called "MAP Paid Credit Hours." Payment for each term is being made according to the equivalent number of credit hours eligible for MAP payment, with a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of 15 MAP paid credit hours. There is a limit on the number of MAP credit hours that can be paid while you are classified by a school as a freshman and sophomore. This is the equivalent of 75 MAP paid credit hours. If this maximum is reached, a student must attain junior status for MAP grant eligibility to resume. The maximum number of MAP paid credit hours that can be received is capped at 135.

NOTE: ISAC reserves the right to change the terms of the State of Illinois MAP grant program, at any time, prior to the beginning of the Fall 2008 semester.

Student Loans

The Federal Stafford Loan program limits, if combined, cannot exceed the established limits and cost of attendance. During the 2008-2009 year a student may be eligible to borrow a Federal Stafford Loan based on the following limits:

You will only be eligible to borrow one loan for one academic year. For example: If you borrow \$3,500 subsidized Stafford Loan as a Freshman, you will not be allowed to borrow a subsequent loan until you advance to the sophomore level. In order to obtain a loan, a student must complete a CSU Federal Stafford Loan Request Form. It is anticipated, at the time of the publication of this Class Schedule Bulletin, that an interactive form will be available online at the Office of Student Financial Aid website beginning July 1, 2008. Students must complete the loan application process on-line. Paper forms will not be accepted. (In the event that the interactive form is not available, students will be able to download a copy of the form. Downloaded forms must then be completed and submitted to the Office of Student Financial Aid.) October 15, 2008 is the last day that the Office of Student Financial aid will accept loan applications for the Fall 2008 semester.

CSU's "Financial Aid Refund/Repayment" Policy

If a CSU student, receiving any federal or state student financial assistance completely withdraws prior to the end of an academic term in which he/she received federal/state aid, federal regulations require CSU to determine the amount of federal and/or state aid that must be returned to the student financial assistance program and/or the amount that must be repaid by the student who has received a cash disbursement of any federal or state aid including book vouchers. If a CSU student completely withdraws after receiving a cash disbursement, including a book voucher, from

any student financial assistance program, CSU will determine the amount that must be repaid by the student to the student financial aid programs by utilizing the student repayment formula.

Student's Repayment

If a student receiving certain federal financial assistance completely withdraws, federal regulation requires Chicago State University to "prorate" and reduce the awards received, according to the actual number of calendar days in which you were enrolled and charged.

If you received a disbursement check prior to your complete withdrawal, based upon "prorate" you may be required to repay a portion or all of such funds to the award program. Before you initiate a complete withdrawal contact the Office of Student Financial Aid for a complete explanation.

Timeline dates will be posted in the Office of Student Financial Aid for recipients of the basic state and federal financial aid programs. Timeline dates do not apply to recipients of other aid that may be based on academic performance, pursuit of a specific program/degree, etc., or aid from private sources.

Debt Management

Students who receive Federal Family Education Loans are required to complete Debt Management Loan Counseling prior to receiving a disbursement and an exit interview when they completely withdraw or graduate from the institution. Students should complete both of these requirements on-line at the Financial Aid website. Go to www.csu.edu, click on "Financial Aid" and then "Loan Counseling." Follow the instructions on the screen.

Federal Work-Study (FWS)/Student State Aid

A limited number of positions are available throughout the university through the Federal Work-Study and State Aid funded student employment programs. Students with exceptional need are awarded FWS/SA eligibility and given the opportunity to be employed. Students wishing consideration for student employment should indicate their interest on the FAFSA. Rates of pay vary, depending upon the type of work and the level of responsibility. A student must be paid at least the minimum wage. Students are responsible for monitoring the time/hours they work so that they will not exceed their award balance.

Veterans Affairs Office

Students receiving Veterans Benefits are required to adhere to the university's academic standing policies as outlined in the university's catalog. A change in enrollment status which occurs after the Veteran's status has been certified must be immediately reported to the Veterans Affairs Office which is located in the Office of Student Financial Aid. Failure to report changes in enrollment status may result in overpayments. An unapproved change of program may cause termination of future benefits.

All information provided in this Student Financial Aid section is subject to change. Any such changes and/or modifications will be reflected on the Office of Student Financial Aid website. It is the responsibility of all students to keep themselves informed as to issues that may affect their financial aid eligibility by regularly monitoring e-mail correspondence from the Office of Student Financial Aid and accessing the Office of Student Financial Aid website and CSU X-Press.

ON CAMPUS: Students registering for off-campus courses only can register in the Extension Services Department, RUC 200 from 9:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m. If enrolling in a combination of on-campus and off-campus courses, students must register on the web.

IN CLASS: Unless noted otherwise in the individual class information, if the course is still open, you may register at the first session of the class. You are strongly urged to register prior to the first class since some courses fill quickly.

ON THE WEB: Obtain a current registration advising pin (RAP) from your academic advisor during the advisement session. Graduate-at-Large students must contact the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School) at (773) 995-2404 or Extension Services at (773) 995-2214 to obtain a RAP. Graduate-at-Large students may begin registering on the web during the period of May 7 – July 30. Regular WEB registration begins for the period August 5 – 20.

FEES: Tuition is based on the status of the student, not the status of the class. Tuition is subject to change.

INSTALLMENT PLAN: Only students registered for six hours or more are eligible for the Installment Plan. There is an additional service fee based on the installment plan selected. Students choosing the Installment Plan Option must utilize the Tuition Management Installment Plan as presented in the Fee and Payment Information section of this bulletin.

REFUNDS: A partial refund will be issued if dropped course(s) result in 1-11 credit hours for the semester and are dropped on or before

September 16: 100% refund if withdrawing from all courses resulting in 0 credit hours for the semester and on or before September 16; 50% refund if withdrawing from all classes after September 16; but on or before September 24. No refunds after September 24.

CLASS SIZE: The University reserves the right to limit the size of classes and to cancel due to insufficient enrollment.

CLASS MEETING: Normally, classes meet once a week for 16 weeks. Sessions consist of 50 minutes of instruction each week for each credit hour, (i.e., a three credit hour course meets 150 minutes per week). Courses meeting for fewer than sixteen weeks compensate with more frequent and / or longer class meetings each week, as detailed in the individual class listing.

PREREQUISITES: Course prerequisites are stated in the Chicago State University Catalog or on the website: www.csu.edu/catalogs.

GRADUATE ADMISSION APPLICATION (NON-DEGREE STUDY): Students enrolling in graduate courses for the first time and who are not currently admitted to a graduate degree program are required to complete a Graduate-at-Large Application. A \$25 application fee must be submitted with the at-large-application. Additionally, proof of a Bachelor's degree must be submitted with the application, (i.e., copy of a transcript illustrating an awarded degree, copy of your diploma, or state teaching certificate). Graduate-at-Large students who have not enrolled in a course at CSU within two years or more (but left in good standing) are required to complete a Readmit Form. A fee is not required with this form. Admitted students who have not attended CSU within the last two years must obtain a departmental advisor's signature. Submit your Extension Registration Form, at-large application or Readmit form, proof of degree, tuition fee, and \$25 at-large application fee to your instructor on the first day of the class, or submit to the Extension Services Department on campus (RUC, Room 200) if enrolling only in extension courses.

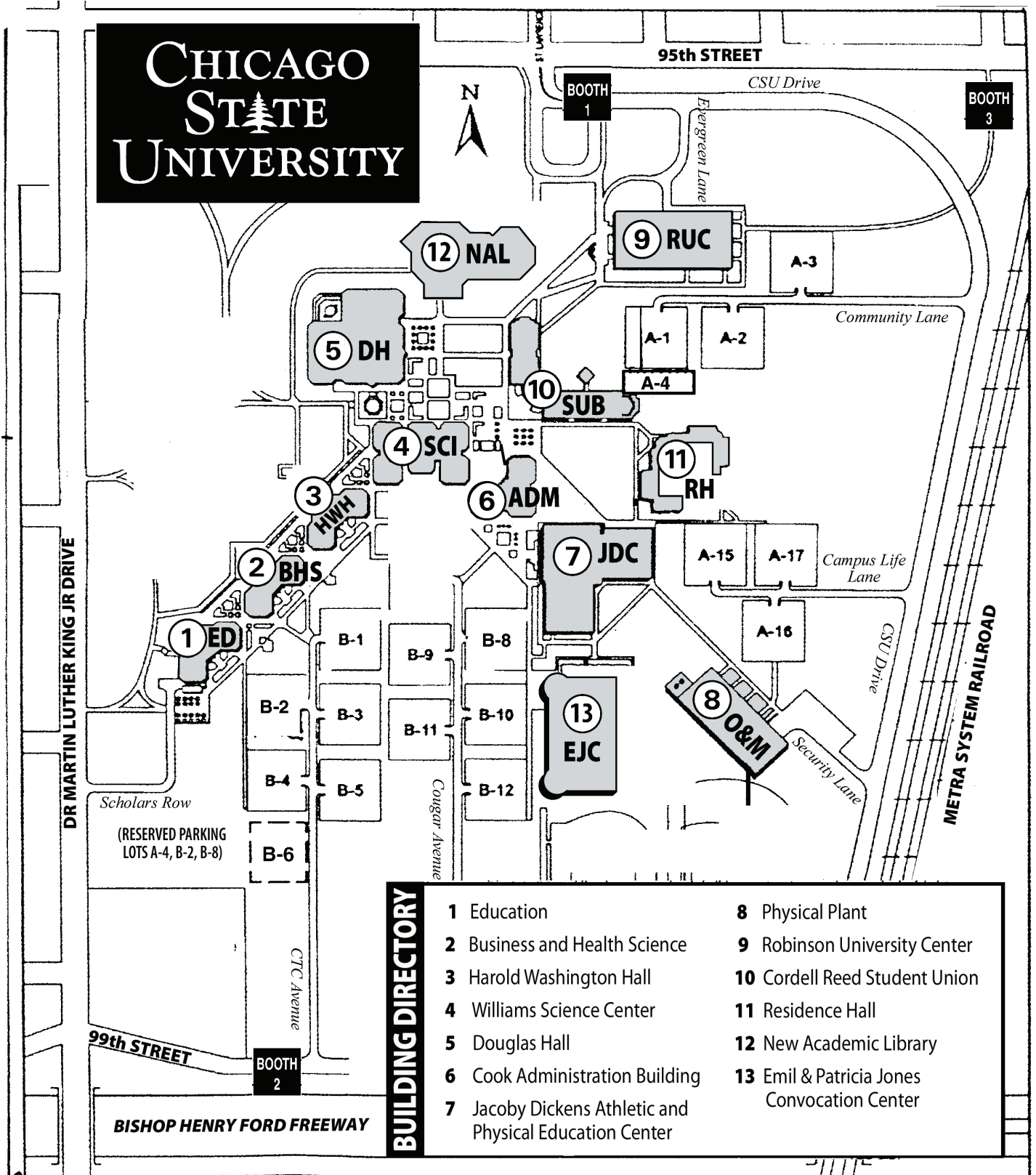

Illinois statute requires each public institution of higher education to "establish a program to assess the oral English language proficiency of all persons providing classroom instruction to students," and to "insure that each person who is not orally proficient in the English language attain such proficiency prior to providing any classroom instruction to students."

Students with complaints about the oral English proficiency of Chicago State faculty should first contact the chairperson of the department involved. The complaint must be in writing and should be as specific as possible. Copies of the complaint must be sent to the appropriate college Dean and to the Provost / Vice President for Academic Affairs.

The chairperson will investigate the complaint and may observe the class. If the chairperson concludes that the faculty member's English is adequate, the chairperson will notify the student, the faculty member, the Dean, and the Provost / Vice President for Academic Affairs. The student may appeal the chairperson's decision to the dean. The dean will then investigate the complaint and follow the same notification procedure. The decision of the dean will be final.

If the chairperson or the dean finds that the faculty member's oral English is unsatisfactory, he or she will make a recommendation to the Provost / Vice President for Academic Affairs. The Provost will take action on this recommendation and notify all parties involved of his or her decision.

Except for the necessary notifications, the identities of all students and faculty involved in oral English proficiency complaints shall remain confidential.
