You must be admitted to the University before you can register for classes. **Undergraduates** go to ADM 200 • **Graduates** go to LIB 234

Select your classes with your academic advisor.

Degree seeking students will receive a Registration Advising PIN (RAP) to register on the web during advisement. • At-large students do not need a RAP to register.

Register for classes.

Register online at **www.csu.edu** during the web registration. See pages 2–3.

Obtain a business receipt from the Cashier (ADM 211) to validate your classes.

To validate your classes means that you must get a business receipt from the cashier. Your classes will be dropped for non-payment if you do not get a receipt. NOTE: Students with financial aid, tuition waivers or scholarships must get a waiver from the financial aid office, ADM 207. Present this waiver to the cashier to obtain a business receipt.

Obtain or update your ID card in LIB 143.

A CSU student ID card is required for all student services.

Tips for a Successful Web Registration • Check your registration status for your

- registration date.
- If you have all the course reference numbers (CRN) for your courses, click on 'Add/Drop Classes' even if this is the first time you are registering for the selected term. The system considers each class an "add," even if it is the first class registered for the term.
- You must click on "submit classes" to secure your selections.
- Scroll down to the bottom of the screen to check for registration errors. Your schedule is not final until you have corrected all registration errors.
- You are advised to print your final schedule.
- Changes to course information may be made after the Class Schedule Bulletin is published. Check CSU X-Press for the most up-to-date course information.

Registration Information

Personal Access Code (PAC)

Your first access to the secure area login requires your User ID (your University ID number, UID) and your Personal Access Code, which is your birth date in the format of MM/DD/YY. *Example:* May 7, 1950 will be 050750.

The system is programmed to request you to immediately change your personal access code (PAC) on your first entry. Your new PAC must be six (6) characters and can be letters, numerals or a combination. Examples: AZ1234 or 135790 or KLMNOP.

You will be prompted to make up a security question and an answer on your first entry. If you forget your PAC click the "Forgot PAC" button. Keep your PAC confidential and change it if you believe it has been compromised.

Registration Advising Personal Identification Number, PIN (RAP)

To register online, you must have a current registration advising PIN (RAP). Degree seeking students (undergraduate and graduate) will receive a RAP from their academic advisors during the advisement session. New RAPs are assigned each term and expire at the end of the regular registration period. At-large-students will not need a RAP to register online effective Summer 2009.

Computer Locations & Help

You can use your own computer, a local library computer or a computer in the Academic Library. CSU X-PRESS registration technical support is available from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday at (773) 995-2038.

Fee Payment

Your fees must be received by the published deadline dates. If you are paying by check or credit card, please click on 'on-line payment' after you have completed your registration. Students with financial aid awards or other tuition waivers must confirm their registration with a paid receipt at the cashier office in ADM-211.

Holds

You will not be able to register if there is a hold (academic or financial) placed on your record. Contact the appropriate office prior to your registration to clear your hold. Most offices are not open evenings or weekends.

Fall 2009 registration will be done via CSU X-Press only.

Instructions for Registering online

STEPS 1–10

- 1. On the Chicago State University home page, www.csu.edu, click 'CSU X- PRESS.'
- 2. Click 'Enter Secure Area.' Scroll down. In the user ID field type your university ID number (UID) (or user ID, SSN) and in the PAC field type your date of birth (mmddyy), then click 'Login.' (If you have registered online before, enter the PAC you created or click 'Forgot PAC' to reset your PAC.)
- **3.** Click 'Student Services and Financial Aid.' Then click 'Registration.'
- **4.** Click 'Term Selection' and select correct term i.e., Fall 2009. Click Submit.
- **5.** Click 'Add/Drop Classes.' You will be prompted to enter an Alternate Pin. Type in the six-digit Registration Advising PIN (RAP) number you were given by your advisor.
- **6.** Scroll down. Type in one five-digit course reference number (CRN) in each box for each course in which you wish to enroll. After you have typed a CRN for each course, click 'Submit Changes.'
- Your courses will appear. Check to see if the subjects, course numbers and sections are correct. If all of the classes for which you submitted CRNs for do not appear, scroll down for error messages. (Correct time conflicts or closed classes by typing in another section of the course. Depending upon the error message, you may have to go back to your advisor for an override.) Click Submit Changes again. Check again to make sure all information is correct and there are no error messages. If no errors, scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on Complete Your Registration. Scroll down to view your charges. Print this page for your records. (If there are no charges on the page, you did not register successfully. Go back to Add/Drop Classes and try again.) Scroll down to the bottom of the page and click 'Detail Schedule' and print this page for your records also.
- **8.** If you are paying by MasterCard, VISA, Discover or check, you can click 'Online Payment' to pay your bill, or call the cashier's office at (773) 995-3571, to pay by phone.
- **9.** If you are a financial aid recipient, or have a scholarship or some other form of tuition waiver, you must obtain a waiver from the financial aid office in the Cook Administration Building, Room 207. Take the waiver to the cashier's window, Cook Administration Building, Room 211 to validate (get a receipt) for your registration.
- **10.** If you plan to pay with cash, your payment must be received in the Cashier's Office before the deadline date noted on the web or published in the Class Schedule Bulletin.

Instructions for Dropping Classes on the Web

Follow instructions 1-5 for registering online. On the Add/Drop Classes page, click on the arrow under 'Action' next to the course you wish to drop. (The word NONE will be next to the arrow.) Click 'Drop Web.' Do this for each course you wish to drop. If you wish to add a class to replace the class you are dropping, type in the five-digit Course Reference Number (CRN) of the course you wish to add in one of the boxes at the bottom of the screen and click 'Submit Changes.' Check for error messages. If you have errors, click 'Submit Changes' again and then type in another CRN. After you have selected your courses with no error messages, click 'Complete Your Registration' at the bottom of the page.

NOTE: You will not be allowed to drop your last class online. If you have validated your classes (received a paid receipt) you will have to submit a withdrawal form to the registrar's office, signed by all appropriate parties. If you have not validated your classes, you may call the registrar's office at (773) 995-2517 to have your last class dropped.

Undergraduate Students

Continuing Students

(Those who have attended at least one term since Fall 2007)

Currently enrolled students who have been accepted as candidates for the bachelor's degree will use the Fall RAP (registration advising PIN) given at the advisement session to register on the CSU X-Press web registration system. If you must register on-campus, you must present your validated CSU student identification card for Spring 2009 with your advisor-signed student schedule request form in the registrar's office (ADM 128).

New Students

If you have never attended Chicago State University and you are seeking a degree, you must first be admitted: undergraduates (ADM 200), graduates (LIB 234). After you have been admitted, you must be advised. Your advisor will give you a Fall 2009 RAP (registration advising PIN) to use the CSU X-Press web registration system.

Returning Students

Undergraduates who have not attended since the Fall 2007 and who were in good standing their last term must file an application for readmission in the registrar's office (ADM 128). Undergraduates must submit transcripts covering all college courses completed since withdrawal. Fall 2009 deadline: August 3, 2009.

Undergraduate students who were dropped from the university, or who were not in good academic standing at the time of withdrawal, should submit to the Office of Admissions (ADM 200) an academic petition form and an application for admission (\$25 fee). Students seeking reinstatement must submit transcripts covering all college courses completed since withdrawal. The letter of acceptance issued by the Director of Admissions will serve as authorization to register. **Fall 2009 deadline: July 15**.

You must be advised to register. Your advisor will give you a Fall RAP (registration advising pin) for use with the CSU X-Press web registration. See Quick Reference Guide for list of departments.

Undergraduate students who were dropped from the University, or who were not in good academic standing at the time of withdrawal, should submit to the Office of Admissions an Academic Petition form and an application for Admission. Students seeking reinstatement must submit transcripts covering all college courses completed since withdrawal. The Letter of Acceptance issued by the Director of Admissions will serve as authorization to register. **Fall 2009 deadline: July 15, 2009.**

You must be advised after you have received authorization by either the Registrar's office or the Admission's office. Your advisor will give you a Fall 2009 RAP (registration advising PIN) to use with the CSU X-Press registration system.

Undergraduate Students-at-Large

Students may attend the university as "students-at-large" in any of the following categories: (1) individuals who are regular students at a regionally accredited college or university and who can demonstrate their good academic standing at their home institution; (2) individuals who are not currently regular students at a regionally accredited college or university but who can demonstrate their good academic standing at the institution last attended; or (3) individuals enrolling at the university as part of a special program or a cooperative agreement between the university and another institution. Students enrolling as students-at-large in category one or two who wish to earn more than 30 credits must be admitted as regular students. Students enrolling as students at-large in category three will abide by the guidelines established for the program or cooperative agreement. At-large students do not need a RAP to register online. For more information and an undergraduate at-large application, contact the undergraduate admissions office, (773) 995-2513.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

Continuing Students

(Those who have attended at least one term since Fall 2007)

MASTER'S DEGREE CANDIDATES

Your graduate advisor will issue your Fall RAP in your advisement session for use on the CSU X-Press Web registration system.

GRADUATE STUDENTS-AT-LARGE

If necessary, you will be referred to a department for advisement and course approval. You do not need a RAP to register online using the CSU X-Press registration system.

New & Returning Students

Master's degree candidates attending for the first time must be advised. Your advisor will issue your RAP (registration advising pin) for use on the CSU X-Press Web registration system during your advisement session.

New graduates-at-large who are attending for the first time must first report to the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School) Office, New Academic Library, Room 234, to complete a short data form. If necessary, you will be referred to a department for advisement

and course approval. You will not need a RAP to register online using the CSU X-Press web registration system.

If you are a master's degree candidate or a student-at-large who has not attended since prior to Spring 2007, an application for readmission must be completed. Forms may be obtained from the graduate school office, LIB 234. Master's degree candidates must obtain approval signatures for re-entry and for advisement. The Graduate School will approve the registration form for the non-degree (graduate-at-large) student to register via CSU X-Press; restricted courses will require departmental approval, to register for graduate or higher level course.

PLEASE NOTE: Cooperating teachers eligible for tuition waivers may contact the Office of Field Placement (773) 995-2392, Education Building, Room 322. Note that the proper parties must sign the waiver form before a waiver is issued. Forms must also be signed in the provost (ADM 306) and financial aid (ADM 207) offices and submitted to the cashier (ADM 211) for proper validation.

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

If you plan to enroll for courses to achieve initial teacher certification and you have been evaluated by the Chicago Board of Education or the State of Illinois, please present your deficiency statement at the College of Education Office of Teacher Certification, (773) 995-2519, Education Building, Room 208. All College of Education requirements for entry to teacher certification sequences must be met and appropriate departmental signatures obtained prior to enrolling in certification courses.

UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES

Civil Service Staff

If you are a Civil Service employee enrolled in an undergraduate program, and intend to pay for tuition with a Civil Service Waiver, please be informed that you may be eligible for financial aid. Please complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid to the U.S. Department of Education, and complete the financial aid application process.

If you need assistance completing the financial aid documents call (773) 995-2371 or contact the Educational Opportunity Center, located in the Douglas Hall, Room 132. To take tuition-free courses, the "Application for Civil Service Employee Education Benefits" must be completed, approved by your supervisor, and sent to the Department of Human Resources, ADM 203. Applications are available in ADM 203.

Civil Service employees are under the same academic regulations as other students at the university. All university employees not possessing a bachelor's degree are limited to a maximum of thirty (30) semester hours of course work prior to their formal admission to the university.

Faculty and Administrators

To take tuition-free courses, employees must receive written approval from their chairperson or supervisor and college dean, where appropriate, indicating the course(s) for enrollment. The written approval then must be submitted to the provost, ADM 306. The program identification code for faculty and administrators not seeking a degree is GSAL. All university employees are subject to the rules and regulations set forth by Chicago State University regarding education benefits for employees.

Tuition Waiver Applicants

Eligible employees and cooperating teachers requesting tuition waivers must present applications to the Office of Financial Aid at CSU with all appropriate signatures by September 15, for the fall term, January 30 for the Spring term and by the first day of classes for any intersession or summer session in which the waiver is presented and the individual enrolls.

All waivers are for the term in which the course is taken, which means applications are to be submitted each term. Waivers do not cover past due bills and will not be accepted after the deadline date.

Advisement

All degree-seeking students are REQUIRED to be advised prior to their registration. Advisors will give the RAP to a student during the advisement session to use with the CSU X-Press web registration system.

Special undergraduate students-at-large (USAL) do not need advisement or a RAP to register through the CSUX-Press web registration system. Master's degree candidates and graduate certificate students must be advised by the department supervising the program to which they have been admitted. RAPs are distributed by graduate advisors.

Graduate-at-large students (GSAL, GSUM) do not need advisement or a RAP to register through the CSU X-Press web registration system. However, special permission is required for at-large students to enroll in any 5000-level or higher graduate course. Students registering online must obtain academic departmental approval prior to attempting to register for these or any other restricted course. Students should not attempt to register for two different sections of the same course. If additional work is desired in a variable credit course, please talk with the department chairperson.

Students should note that the time for advisement is not during registration. To speed up your registration, please have your schedule prepared with alternative courses to take, if certain course are closed.

Student Registration Responsibility

It is the responsibility of each student to enter the proper course reference number (CRN) for all registration transactions. A student should only register for advised courses. Abuse of the web registration system will result in the ineligibility to use the system in the future. You are responsible for obtaining a receipt for payment on your account by the published payment due dates, even if your account is being paid through a grant, scholarship, loan or another party. You must confirm your registration with a paid receipt from the cashier's office (ADM 211).

If an admitted student presents unofficial transcripts as a basis for advising, the student is responsible for any consequences related to course selection, registration and academic progress based upon the unofficial transcripts.

All students who register via CSU X-Press April 27 – July 29, including students with financial assistance, must obtain a registration receipt by July 30, 2009. Students are to register according to their student classification. Please refer to the registration calendar to determine the time frame you are to register on CSU X-Press. (See registration calendar, above.)

If you are unsure of your student classification, please refer to your unofficial transcript on CSU X-Press or contact your academic advisor for assistance. Undergraduate student classification is calculated by the number of credit hours earned. Credit hours currently enrolled are not calculated in your student classification.

Students are strongly advised to make an appointment with their advisors prior to registering or changing programs.

Web Registration/ Program Change August 3 – 19 • 7a.m. - 10p.m.

All students, including students with financial assistance, must obtain a registration business receipt by September 10, 2009. New and continuing students who did not advance-enroll may register according to the registration schedule via CSU X-Press.

A registration advising PIN may be obtained from academic advisors. Students who advance-enrolled for the Fall 2009 semester may change their programs via CSU X-Press by dropping or adding classes according to the registration calendar. Drop/Add forms are available from the academic department offices.

You may only add classes that are open or become available. You will not be allowed to drop your last class on CSU X-Press. Please contact the Office of the Registrar at (773) 995-2522 for information on dropping your last class.

All students, including students with financial assistance, must obtain a registration business receipt by September 10, 2009.

A \$100 late registration fee will be charged after August 23. Late registration and late change of program will end at 10 p.m. on August 23. The late registration fee is nonrefundable.

Drop a Course(s): A student can drop a course(s) on CSU X-Press after the late change of program period until Tuesday, September 8. After September 8, students must receive an advisor's approval for dropped course(s) on their change of program form. Withdrawal from a course(s) is not complete until the form is submitted to the registrar's office (ADM 128) and approved by a records and registration staff member. Errors in the completion of change of program form are the student's responsibility.

NOTE: Students who reduce their credit hour load below 12 semester hours by September 8 are eligible for a partial refund.

F-1 international students are REQUIRED to receive authorization from the Office of International Programs' designated school official BEFORE dropping a course that will reduce the F-1 student's credit hour load below 12 semester hours.

Academic Regulations

Academic Progression Policy

A student who has not successfully completed the academic skills requirements will have hold(s) placed on their record that will remain until the specified requirements have been met.

Academic Skills Courses & Placement Assessment

Freshmen: Once accepted for admission to Chicago State University, all freshmen must take the university diagnostic examinations in English, mathematics, and reading by the end of the first term in residence. All freshmen must either meet the minimal requirements of the university diagnostic examinations or pass the appropriate academic skills course, namely English 1230, Reading 1500, or Math 0990. To exit from these courses, student must pass the appropriate examination.

Transfer Students: Transfer students who have not completed an associate's degree (A.A. degree or A.S. degree) must take proficiency examinations in English and Reading. Transfer students who transfer in one or two general education math courses with a C or better and whose majors do not require additional mathematics courses do not have to take the proficiency examination in mathematics. Transfer students who do not transfer general education math or who are required by their majors to take more math must take the proficiency examinations in mathematics.

Transfer students who have earned an associate's degree (A.A. degree or A.S. degree) or who have completed sixty (60) hours or more from a combination of two-year and four-year institutions, who have completed the Illinois General Education Core, are not required to take the proficiency examinations in English, reading or math.

Cancelled Classes

The university reserves the right to limit the size of the classes and to cancel classes for which there is insufficient enrollment. If the class for which you are registered is cancelled, you will automatically be dropped from the class. If you do not find an alternative class, a tuition refund will be processed to your account according to the refund policy.

Students receiving financial aid benefits may wish to consult with their financial aid counselor concerning any award implications.

Class Attendance

Students are expected to attend all class sessions in the course sections for which they are registered unless prevented by illness, an official university activity, or other urgent and unavoidable reasons. The responsibility for maintaining class attendance records rests with each faculty member. Students are expected to arrange with faculty members to complete class work and all assignments when classes are missed.

The following is the university policy on class attendance:

- An instructor may drop students who do not attend the first day of class and make no attempt to contact the instructor or department chairperson prior to the absence. The instructor may report students who do not attend the first two weeks of class without evidence of a legitimate excuse to the registrar who will drop the student from the class
- Instructors are required to monitor and keep records of the attendance of students at all class meetings. If a student's total absences are equal to or exceed the equivalent of two weeks of instruction, the instructor may drop the student from the course with a grade of W by September 23. The instructor may assign a nonattendance grade of W/A or W/N. (See WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY)
- To drop or withdraw from courses, the student must use the drop/ withdrawal form, have an advisor sign it, and then submit the form to the registrar's office. If a student stops attending a class but fails to withdraw officially from the class before the official drop date, the result may be a failing grade. Although the instructor may drop a student for nonattendance, it is ultimately the student's responsibility to drop the class. (See WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY).

If you are registering for a class and you are informed that your name does not appear on the official preliminary and subsequent class rosters, it is your responsibility to investigate the matter immediately by contacting the Office of Records and Registration.

Graduate Students: Graduate students-at-large may enroll in graduate-level courses by obtaining permission from the academic department supervising the courses prior to attempting course registration.

Restrictions or safeguards are built into the registration system that prevent registration in these courses by students-at-large. Students at-large who wish to enroll for graduate courses should first check with department graduate advisors or chairpersons to have these restrictions lifted prior to registration.

Credit Hour Load

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS: The maximum credit hour load for the Fall semester is 16 credit hours. This includes all day session courses, evening courses, extension courses and courses taken elsewhere. Additional hours beyond (16) must be approved by the department. The registrar's office must record that approval in the system. Students whose CSU cumulative grade point average is 3.0 or better may register for a program of eighteen (18) semester hours. Additional hours beyond 16 must be approved by the department. The registrar's office must record that approval in the system.

Students who have a cumulative CSU grade point average of 1.99 or less are limited to a maximum of 12 credit hours or four courses. Although there is no minimum credit-hour load for students, the following minimum credit-hour loads are recommended: Veterans receiving benefits under Public Law 89-358 "Veterans Re-adjustments Benefits Act of 1966," must carry 12 credit hours to be eligible for full subsistence allowances during the Fall semester. Students may not be registered at other colleges without written permission from the Academic Evaluation and Advisement Office, ADM 128. This permission MUST be obtained prior to registration at either college.

F-1 international students must carry a minimum of 12 hours during fall and spring terms to maintain lawful F-1 student status in the United States.

GRADUATE STUDENTS: A full-time academic load of graduate courses is nine (9) hours in the Fall semester. Exceptions to the graduate course credit hour load may be made with the approval of the graduate faculty advisors and/or the department chairperson and the graduate dean. Students may not be registered at other colleges and universities without approval of their advisors and the graduate dean. Permission must be obtained prior to registration at either college.

Placement Assessment (ADM 126)

Students must have a picture ID to take the placement assessment. The assessment placement schedule is posted in the office, as well as on the examination office web site.

Prerequisites

Prerequisites are listed in the university catalog or on CSU's website at www.csu.edu/catalogs. A student should not attempt to register for a course unless she/he meets the prerequisites, if any, for the course. If a student does not meet the prerequisite for a course, the student may be dropped from the course. Please consult your academic advisor about prerequisites for your courses.

Undergraduate Repeat Policy

Students are allowed to repeat a course and have the highest grade earned count toward their cumulative grade point average. Please note that certain financial aid programs may not cover tuition for repeated courses. Students should contact a financial aid advisor when attempting to repeat a course, to determine eligibility.

Withdrawal from the University

Students who withdraw from the university by September 8 are eligible for a total refund of all mandatory fees. Students are permitted to withdraw from the university until Wednesday, September 23, after completing a change of program/ withdrawal form. Students who withdraw from the university during the period from September 9 to September 23 are eligible for a 50% refund of the eligible tuition and fees. No refunds will be issued after this date if a student withdraws from the university.

Students must receive the approval of the advisor, bursar, and the financial aid office to withdraw during this period. A withdrawal from the university is not complete until the change of program/ withdrawal form is submitted and approved by a records and registration staff member. Students who withdraw must complete a withdrawal survey when they submit their withdrawal form to the Office of the Registrar (ADM 128).

Errors in the information provided on the change of program/withdrawal form are the student's responsibility.

Students can request to drop or withdraw from a course after midterm grades are submitted until Friday, Friday, November 13, 2009. The form must have the instructor's signature, student's signature, and the grade of W/P or W/F must be circled by the instructor. It is the student's responsibility to submit the signed form to the Office of the Registrar, ADM 128, no later than Friday, November 13, 2009. Forms submitted after Friday, November 13, 2009 will not be accepted.

Students can also request to be totally withdrawn from the university prior to the start of the final exam period. Each instructor must sign the post mid-term drop form in the space for written permission and circle the grade of W/P or W/F. It is the student's responsibility to submit the signed form to the Office of the Registrar no later than Monday, November 30, 2009 prior to final exams. Grades of either W/P or W/F will appear on the final grade sheet for students who have requested a total withdrawal prior to the final exam period.

Students who do not opt to drop or withdraw after midterm or request a total withdrawal for the semester prior to final exams will receive grades of A, B, C, D, I, P, or F as final grades.

Directory Information

Chicago State University, in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, has designated the degrees a student has been awarded, current enrollment status (full-time/part-time, withdrawal) and academic information used to determine eligibility for scholarships or awards as directory (public) information. The university receives many inquiries for directory information from a variety of sources, including prospective employers, licensing agencies, government agencies, friends, and relatives.

Students have the right to have this directory information withheld from the public if they so desire. Forms to request directory information be withheld can be obtained in the Office of the Registrar (ADM 128). The university, in good faith, will not release information not listed as directory information unless the student provides written consent for the release.

Distance Learning (LIB 428)

Hardware and software requirements: Access to a personal computer with Windows (2000, ME, XP); Microsoft Office 2003 (Word, Excel and Power Point); Pentium 4 or faster processor; at least 512 megabytes of memory (RAM) and a 56K modem with internet access. Broadband is preferable. Microsoft Vista and Office 2007 are not supported by BlackBoard at this time.

Distance Learning Courses: A web or online course is led by an instructor using a web browser to access a course management system for synchronous and asynchronous instruction and assessment. Some examinations may be proctored and must be taken on campus or at another mutually agreed location. A **hybrid course** is led by an instructor using a web browser to access a course management system for asynchronous instruction where some course sessions are scheduled on campus or at other designated locations, as listed in the comments below the course listing.

Registration Requirements: During or before registration students MUST consult with an advisor regarding admittance to WEB and HYBRID courses. You MUST also have some experience with navigating the Internet and using it as research tool and communication resource

Remember, you will not receive a copy of your grades by mail. If you need assistance using CSU X-Press, please stop by the Office of the Registrar, or call (773) 995-2038.

Graduation Applications

BACHELOR'S DEGREE CANDIDATES must submit graduation applications to the academic advisor by Tuesday, September 8, 2009. The deadline for filing your advisor-signed application for Fall 2009 in the Office of

MASTER'S DEGREE CANDIDATES may obtain applications for a degree audit (graduation) from the School of Graduate & Professional Studies (Graduate School) office, (LIB 234) or by calling (773) 995-2404. (No cash payments are accepted in the Graduate School office). Signatures are required for all students. Students obtaining certification with their program must obtain the departmental stamp from the Office of Teacher Certification (ED 208) as well. The deadline for filing your Fall 2009 graduation application is Monday, September 14, 2009.

Immunization Requirement

Illinois Public Health Act Administrative Code Part 694 specifies that any enrolled student born on or after January 1, 1957, who is a first time freshman, a transfer student, or reentering the university after an absence of more than one semester, will be required to show proof of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria and tetanus prior to registration. Evidence of immunity from these diseases is required for students. A registered health care provider must verify documentation of immunization and testing. A high school health record with proof of immunization, if properly noted and certified, is acceptable documentation for residents of Illinois. Individuals who are not properly immunized will not be allowed to register. Proof of proper immunization must be on file prior to registration.

Evidence of tuberculin testing is required for all international and residence hall students, as well as students in programs that require proof of immunizations (e.g., health programs and education).

Students who need to obtain immunizations or information regarding immunizations may contact their primary care providers or their local public health clinic. Students who reside outside of Chicago should contact the public health clinic of their townships or counties

Students who wish to prove immunization requirements must complete the student immunization form and send it to: Wellness/Health Center, Chicago State University, 9501 S. King Drive / ADM 131, Chicago, Illinois 60628. Students can call the Wellness Center at (773) 995-2010.

Students who fail to comply with the immunization requirements will be assessed a \$25.00 non-compliance fee.

Parking

Individuals using the university parking facilities must use a key card for entry/exit or pay \$4 per entry at the parking lot entrance.

CSU. A valid CSU I.D. card is required to use all university facilities, including the library and the computer center. In addition, it is required to obtain free or reduced admission to university events. This card must be presented on demand for official university identification. There is a \$20 ID replacement fee. No fee will be charged for enrollment verifications issued to: Public Aid/Department of Human Services; federal government agencies; banks; child care services and subsidized housing services. A pickup service is not available for enrollment verifications.

Validation

What is validation?

Validation is any form of payment in the following manner:

- Cash
- Check/money order
- Charge
- Third party letter (outside agency)
- Financial aid waiver

What does validation do for a student?

- Validation locks students into their classes so that they will not be dropped unless the student or instructor does so.
- Every student should formally withdraw if s/he is not going to attend the university.
- If you have already validated with cash, check, charge, third party letter or a financial aid waiver, your class(es) will not be dropped. If you make a payment to your account for parking, library fines, meal plans, or any other items for the current term, your classes for that term will not be dropped.

Calculate Your Tuition

This formula shows how to tabulate your tuition charges.

- *On-Campus:* (Total number of credit hours selected) x (tuition per credit hour) + (fees applicable to your total credit hours) = your tuition.
- Off -Campus: (Total number of credit hours selected) x (tuition per credit hour) + (fees applicable to your total credit hours) = your tuition.
- *Distance Learning:* (Total number of credit hours selected) x (tuition per credit hour) + \$50 distance learning fee = your tuition.

NOTE: Some courses carry additional fees. These fees are not included in the tuition and mandatory fee information. The list of courses with additional fees is in the back of this bulletin.

Mandatory fees

Mandatory fees apply to all on-campus students and students with a combination off-campus and on-campus schedules regardless of student level or residency status.

Any combination of extension or distance learning courses and on-campus courses will have mandatory fees charged.

Four Year Guaranteed Tuition Plan

The "Truth in Tuition" bill mandates that Illinois public universities provide four years of level tuition for new students enrolling for the first time beginning with the Fall 2004-2005 academic year. Undergraduate and transfer students enrolling at CSU for the first time after Fall 2004 and students who enroll for the first time every semester beginning Fall 2004-2005 and thereafter will maintain the same tuition rate for four consecutive years, or until the student reaches 120 credit hours. The hours will be extended to accommodate any majors or programs that exceed the 120 hours or four years. The guaranteed rate will remain in effect, except in the event of a break in enrollment of more than one year (two semesters, excluding summer school). In no case will the initial guaranteed rate be valid beyond five years of total enrollment. A tuition surcharge of 10% will be assessed for students who extend beyond the four-year guarantee period (120 credit hours) or five years of total enrollment. For all other students, CSU's current tuition program will remain in effect.

IMPORTANT NOTE: A change in major will not affect the guaranteed rate. That rate will continue for the number of credit hours necessary to complete the new major, not to exceed five years of total enrollment. Beyond five years of total enrollment, a 10% surcharge will be assessed.

Extended illness and military service will be given special consideration. The rate guarantee will be extended on a case-by-case basis through the student appeal process.

Transfer student rates will be guaranteed based upon 120 credit hours less the number of credits transferred at the time of first enrollment. All extensions and exceptions that apply to new freshmen will be extended to new transfer students.

Credit hour pricing / Beginning with the Fall 2004-2005 academic year, tuition and mandatory fees will be charged on a per credit hour basis up to 15 hours. This 15 credit hour cap will allow students to complete 120 credit hours in eight semesters or four years. Credit hours exceeding 15 will be charged at the rate for 15 credit hours.

Out-of-state undergraduate tuition / Undergraduate out-of-state (non-Illinois resident) per credit hour tuition is twice the resident per credit hour tuition. The Four Year Guaranteed Tuition Plan is extended to all undergraduate out-of-state new freshmen and transfer students.

Out-of-state graduate tuition rates / *Graduate* out-of-state (non-Illinois resident) per credit hour tuition is twice the resident per credit hour tuition.

Payment and Refund Policy

No registration transaction is complete until the business office has processed the transaction and the student has been issued a printed receipt. If you register online, please confirm your registration by obtaining a paid receipt for your Fall registration at the cashier's office. All students registering for Fall must obtain a receipt for their first installment.

- 1. **Students who have outstanding debts** at Chicago State University will not be permitted to register until those debts have been paid.
- Discover, MasterCard, Telecheck, VISA, cash, money orders, cashier's checks, certified checks, personal checks and traveler's checks will be accepted for tuition and fees. ECAP also provides electronic check approval that takes funds from your checking account within 48 hours of the time the check is written to CSU. Business checks will not be accepted.

- Students who have presented two NSF (not sufficient funds) checks to the university, even though restitution has been made, will be required to pay for their registration with cash, money orders, certified checks, traveler's checks, MasterCard, VISA or Discover. Business checks will not be accepted.

5. Installment Payment Option

- A. **Eligible:** All Illinois resident students registering for six (6) or more hours during advance, regular and late registration.
- B. **Non-eligible:** Students who have tuition and fee charges that amount to less than the required deposit due to financial aid credits are not eligible. Students registering for less than six (6) hours are not eligible.
- C. Tuition Management Installment Plan: Chicago State University offers an interest-free monthly payment plan to distribute your education expenses over time instead of one large payment. For more information, or to enroll, call (800) 722-4867 (TMS/ 24 hours a day) and speak with an education payment counselor or log onto www.csu.edu/. Or, you can log on directly to Tuition Management Systems at www.afford.com. Only students enrolling for three (3) credit hours or more are allowed to use the Tuition Management Installment Plan. Students using the installment payment option are required to make an initial payment at the time of registration or by the payment deadline date of September 10, 2009. Please remember your initial deposit must go to Chicago State or your registration will be cancelled. The enrollment fee for using the installment plan varies according to the number of payments in your plan. Whether or not you are on the installment plan with TMS, you will still pay the deferred fee amount if tuition is not paid in full at the time of registration. The deferred fee is non-refundable.

Pay On-Line

Register and pay your bill online. Visit www.csu.edu, then click 'CSU X-Press.' Enter the secure area to reach the log in prompt. Enter your user ID and your PAC number. Click 'Login' and at the next prompt click 'Student Services and Financial Aid.' You will then click 'Student Records' followed by 'On-Line Payments.'

1. Refunds

The service fee is nonrefundable; the down payment is refundable in accordance with the university refund policy. Selecting the installment payment option can not extend the refund period. Final payment is due on withdrawals after the refund period.

2. Final Payment

Partial or complete payment will be accepted at any time; however, the total balance must be paid according to your TMS payment plan, to avoid any additional charges. Final payment is due November 5.

3. Default

Failure to make a complete payment on time: failure to make payment according to your payment plan will cause payment default and a \$25 delinquent fee will be assessed each semester that the balance is outstanding. In addition, a hold will be placed on your academic record and you will not be permitted to register for subsequent terms until the balance is paid in full.

4. Your financial responsibilities

If you fail to meet the terms of your installment payment agreement, you will not be eligible for academic credit for enrolled courses. In addition, Chicago State University may report your account to the credit bureau, place your student account with an outside collection agency and assign the account to the State of Illinois Off-Set System. It is further understood that all reasonable collection costs, fees or legal expenses incurred by Chicago State University and any outside agency in securing payment is your responsibility. These fees could range from 25% to 50% of your unpaid balance.

NOTE: Chicago State University is under no obligation to send individual bills to students. Reminder notices will be placed in university publications.

Refund Policy

- 1. **Partial refund** (less than 12 hours): A partial reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made to the accounts of students who reduce their credit hour load below 12 semester hours during the period beginning August 24, 2009 and ending September 8, 2009.
- **2. 100% refund** upon complete withdrawal: A total reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made upon complete formal withdrawal from the university during the period beginning August 24, 2009 and ending September 8, 2009.
- **3.** 50% refund upon complete withdrawal: A 50% reversal of tuition and refundable fee charges will be made upon complete formal withdrawal from the university during the period beginning September 9, 2009 and ending September 21, 2009.

NOTE: Actual refund amounts may vary depending on factors such as deferred payment option and financial aid award reductions. Refund checks are mailed. Refund checks are mailed. Please allow four to six weeks for processing from the final refund date of September 21, 2009.

Policy on Returned Checks

All checks are processed through Telecheck. Any returned check will incur a \$20 Chicago State University return check fee and a \$25 fee payable to Telecheck, for a total of \$45. If you reimburse Chicago State University directly for any check you will still be assessed the \$25 fee by Telecheck, and

an additional \$25 delinquent payment fee by Chicago State University.

It is the responsibility of the student to maintain a current address in the registrar's office.

- Students who fail to pay their tuition by the due date will be cancelled from their classes! To be reinstated, you must pay a fee of \$100, plus your full tuition! Pay on or before the date to avoid the penalty!
- The late registration fee is \$100!

Student Health Insurance

CRSU 247 • (773) 995-4533

The basic student health plan for accident and sickness is mandatory for students, undergraduate and graduate, who enroll with 12 hours or more. The fee applies to students with on-campus semester hours and students with a combination of off-campus and on-campus semester hours. Students (with 12 hours or more) are automatically billed and enrolled in the mandatory health plan. Students who have coverage have the option of waiving enrollment in the CSU plan before the September 11, 2009 deadline if they have equal or better coverage.

Students enrolled with 12 or more semester hours are automatically charged a fee for student health insurance on their tuition accounts through the Bursar's office. There is an additional cost to insure dependents. The Fall 2009 health insurance cost per student is not available at the time of publication. Please contact the student health insurance office for more information at (773) 995-4533.

Coverage Period

Students enrolled in the insurance plan for the Fall 2009 semester will receive coverage until the beginning of the Spring 2010 semester.

Part-time students now eligible for coverage

Part-time students (enrolled in 6-11 credit hours) will be allowed to enroll in the student health insurance plan on a voluntary enrollment basis. Part-time students must enroll before the September 11, 2009 deadline.

Cancellation Requirements

An insurance cancellation form must be submitted every semester a student enrolls in 12 credit hours or more. Students with equal or better insurance coverage may apply for cancellation of the mandatory fee before the September 11, 2009 deadline. A copy of insurance card and ID must accompany cancellation form. The forms are available during registration or may be obtained from the Office of Student Health Insurance (CRSU 247) before the Fall deadline.

NOTE: Don't wait until you receive a bill with the insurance charge itemized, or you might miss the deadline to cancel. Cancellation requests are not accepted after September 11, 2009. Students insured under the plan will receive their ID cards by mail. Please make sure a current address is on file with the registrar's office. Contact the student health insurance office for more information at (773) 995-4533.

Student Financial Aid

Deadlines and policies are available in the Office of Financial Aid, Office of Student Financial Aid and on the financial aid website. The university provides an established financial assistance program designed to best meet the needs of Chicago State University students. Assistance is available to eligible students in the form of scholarships, grants, assistantships, student employment and loans. All students wishing to be considered for financial assistance must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

To be eligible for Federal Grants

Students must be enrolled in a program leading to a degree/certificate, to be eligible for Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Grants, Federal College Work-Study, Federal Stafford Loans, Federal Perkins Loan and the Illinois Student Assistance Commission MAP Grant.

Special students (at-large, conditionally admitted Graduate students, or students enrolled in contract courses) are not eligible for state or federal financial assistance. Generally, students must be enrolled for at least six (6) credit hours, to be eligible for assistance from these programs.

Undergraduate students must be enrolled for at least nine (9) hours, to be considered three-quarter time, and twelve (12) or more hours in order to be considered full time. Nine hours is considered full time for master's candidates; five (5) hours part-time. A change in enrollment status (hours

enrolled and/or grade level) that occurs after a financial aid recipient's original registration must be reported immediately, in writing, to the Office of Student Financial Aid. Failure to report changes in enrollment status may result in overpayment, cancellation of benefits, and jeopardize future eligibility for student financial assistance.

Students selected for verification by the U.S. Department of Education or the university will be required to provide requested documentation before their financial aid awards can be processed.

Review your financial aid status anytime

Students may review their financial aid status at any time on the CSU X-Press website. This website provides students with information relating to the amount of their financial aid awards, if any, as well as, any requirements that they might need to fulfill, such as, but not limited to, submitting verification documents, tax forms, SAP (Satisfactory Academic Progress) petitions, etc., before their financial aid package may be finalized.

The Office of Student Financial Aid no longer mails document tracking and award letters to continuing students. Instead, students are notified via e-mail that there is "activity" on their financial aid accounts and that they should go to the CSU X-Press website to review their status. All continuing CSU students have been assigned an e-mail account. It is every student's responsibility to access his/her e-mail periodically and to review any communication from the Office of Student Financial Aid.

Financial Aid Waivers: A limited number of "temporary financial aid waivers" may be issued to students who have submitted all accurate financial aid documentation: accurate and signed Student Aid Report, income documentation, and additional documentation requested by the Office of Student Financial Aid prior to the academic term. Waivers are issued through the Office of Student Financial Aid and are contingent upon pending financial aid, enrollment status, and academic progress standards. Students are responsible for payment if funds are not received due to program limitations.

Student Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress

Policy and Procedures

Federal and state regulations require Chicago State University to establish and implement a "Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy" for students. Chicago State University's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy measures whether eligible undergraduate/graduate students are progressing at a reasonable rate toward the completion of their educational objectives. Students must comply with this policy to maintain their continued financial aid eligibility. Copies of the current Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy are available for students in the Office of Student Financial Aid. The document is also available for review in both the undergraduate and graduate catalog, as well as on the Chicago State University website.

Mitigating circumstances/Appeal Process

Students who fail to make satisfactory academic progress may petition for reinstatement of their eligibility to the Financial Aid Appeals Board. The student must document mitigating circumstances, such as injury, illness, family death or other emergencies. Students appealing for reinstatement of their financial aid eligibility will be required to seek assistance through academic support services offered by the university. Students whose appeals are denied will be required to sit out financial aid for one semester. In that semester they must:

- a) fulfill stipulations of a NEW contract and
- b) attain a minimum semester G.P.A. as specified and,
- c) successfully meet requirements of the quantitative measure. Students who have fulfilled all of the above requirements can apply for probationary financial aid status. If granted, they must spend a semester on financial aid probation. To exit this probation, they must fulfill requirements specified under "Exiting Probation." Students who are terminated from financial aid eligibility and subsequently reinstated are considered to be in probationary status.

NOTE: The Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy is subject to change without notice. The Office of Student Financial Aid will make every attempt to provide students with timely notice regarding their satisfactory academic progress status. However, it is every student's responsibility to read the policy and monitor his/her own progress.

ISAC Monetary Award Limitations

The State of Illinois MAP grants, which are administered by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC), are tracked by the equivalent number of semester hours of MAP benefits paid on a student's behalf. This is called "MAP paid credit hours." Payment for each term is being made according to the equivalent number of credit hours eligible for MAP payment, with a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of 15 MAP paid credit hours. There is a limit on the number of MAP credit hours that can be paid while a student is classified as a freshman and sophomore. This is the equivalent of 75 MAP paid credit hours. If this maximum is reached, a student must attain junior status for MAP grant eligibility to resume. The maximum number of MAP paid credit hours that can be received is capped at 135.

NOTE: ISAC reserves the right to change the terms of the State of Illinois MAP grant program, at any time, prior to the beginning of the Fall 2009 semester.

Student Loans

The Federal Stafford Loan program limits, if combined, cannot exceed the established limits and cost of attendance. During the 2009-2010 year a student may be eligible to borrow a Federal Stafford Loan based on the following limits:

You will only be eligible to borrow one loan for one academic year. For example: If you borrow \$3,500 through a subsidized Stafford Loan as a freshman, you will not be allowed a subsequent loan until you advance to the sophomore level. To obtain a loan, a student must complete a CSU Federal Stafford Loan request form. This form may be downloaded from the financial aid website. Go to www.csu.edu, click 'Financial Aid' and then click 'Apply for Loans.' Downloaded forms must be completed and submitted to the Office of Student Financial Aid. October 15, 2009 is the last day that the Office of Student Financial aid will accept loan applications for the Fall 2009 semester.

Financial Aid Refund/Repayment Policy

If a student who receives any federal and/or state student financial assistance completely withdraws prior to the end of an academic term in which s/he receives federal/state aid, federal regulations require CSU to prorate or reduce the award(s) received, according to the actual number of calendar days in which the student was enrolled. Funds to which the student was not entitled, due to the proration calculation, must be returned to the federal/state award program(s). If a student's charges exceed the prorated awards remaining on her/his account, a balance will be owed to the university. If a student receives a disbursement check prior to obtaining a complete withdrawal-or use some of the awarded funds for a book voucher-based upon the proration, s/he will be required to repay a portion or all of such funds to the university and/or the award program(s). Before initiating a complete withdrawal, contact the Office of Student Financial Aid for a complete explanation.

Timeline dates will be posted in the Office of Student Financial Aid for recipients of the basic state and federal financial aid programs. Timeline dates do not apply to recipients of other aid that may be based on academic performance, pursuit of a specific program/degree, etc., or aid from private sources.

Debt Management

Students who receive federal family education loans are required to complete debt management loan counseling prior to receiving a disbursement and an Exit Interview when they drop to less than half-time enrollment, completely withdraw or graduate from the institution. Students must complete both of these requirements online at the financial aid website. Go to www.csu.edu, click 'Financial Aid' and then 'Loan Counseling.' Follow the instructions on the screen.

Federal Work-Study (FWS)/Student State Aid

A limited number of positions are available throughout the university through the federal work-study and state aid funded student employment programs. Students with exceptional need are awarded FWS/SA eligibility and given the opportunity to be employed. Students wishing consideration for student employment should indicate their interest on the FAFSA. Rates of pay vary, depending upon the type of work and the level of responsibility. A student must be paid at least the minimum wage. Students are responsible for monitoring the time/hours they work so that they will not exceed their award balance.

Veterans Affairs Office

Students receiving veterans benefits are required to adhere to the university's academic standing policies as outlined in the university's catalog. A change in enrollment status that occurs after the veteran's status has been certified must be immediately reported to the Veterans Affairs Office which is located in the Office of Student Financial Aid. Failure to report changes in enrollment status may result in overpayments. An unapproved change of program may cause termination of future benefits.

Financial Aid Website, Email and CSU X-Press

All information provided in this student financial aid section is subject to change. Any such changes and/or modifications will be reflected on the Office of Student Financial Aid website. It is the responsibility of all students stay informed about issues that may affect their financial aid eligibility by regularly monitoring email correspondence from the Office of Student Financial Aid and accessing the Office of Student Financial Aid website and CSU X-Press.

You can also fax your registration form to (773) 995-2941. Tuition may be paid by check, money order, Discover, VISA, or MasterCard. Call the Department of Extension Services for tuition payment instructions. Deadline for registering by mail or fax is August 31, 2009.

ON CAMPUS: Students registering exclusively for off-campus courses can register in the Department of Extension Services, JDC 201 from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If enrolling in a combination of on-campus and off-campus courses, students must register via CSU X-Press.

IN CLASS: Unless noted otherwise in the individual class information, you may register at the first session of the class, if the course is still open. However, you are strongly urged to register prior to the first class, since some courses fill quickly.

ON THE WEB: A degree-seeking student must obtain a current registration advising PIN (RAP) from an academic advisor during the advisement session. At-large students do not need a RAP to register through the CSU X-Press web registration system. Students may begin registering online between March 23 and May 27. See Fall 2009 calendar section for details.

FEES: Tuition is based on the status of the student, not the status of the class. Tuition is subject to change.

NOTE: Updated tuition and fee rates for the Fall 2009 session were not available at the time of publication. Please contact the Office of Financial Affairs for more information at (773) 995-2470.

TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS: Tuition payments can be made by check or money order. Mail to the Department of Extension Services, Chicago State University, 9501 S. King Drive / JDC 201, Chicago, Illinois 60628. Write the correct course number and section number on the check or money order. Also, enclose a telephone number where you can be reached, if required. Please mail at least seven days prior to the due date. Call the CSU Cashier's Office directly at (773) 995-3571 to make credit card payments with Discover, MasterCard or VISA, or go online at www.csu.edu. See fee and payment information section for additional instructions.

INSTALLMENT PLAN: Only students registered for six hours or more are eligible for the installment plan. There is an additional service fee based on the installment plan selected. Students choosing the installment plan option must utilize the tuition management installment plan, as presented in the front of this bulletin.

REFUNDS: See Refund Policy.

CLASS SIZE: The university reserves the right to limit the size of classes and to cancel due to insufficient enrollment.

CLASS MEETING: Normally, classes meet once a week for 16 weeks. Sessions consist of 50 minutes of instruction each week for each credit hour (i.e., a three-credit hour course meets 150 minutes per week). Courses meeting for fewer than 16 weeks compensate with more frequent and/or longer class meeting each week, as detailed in the individual class listing.

PREREQUISITES: Course prerequisites are stated in the Chicago State University catalog or CSU's website: www.csu.edu/catalogs.

GRADUATE ADMISSION APPLICATION

(NON- DEGREE STUDY): Students enrolling in graduate courses for the first time and who are not currently admitted to a graduate degree program are required to complete a graduate-at-large application. A \$25 application fee must be submitted with the at-large application. Additionally, proof of a bachelor's degree must be submitted with the application, (i.e., copy of a transcript illustrating an awarded degree, copy of diploma, or state teaching certificate). Graduate at-large students who have not enrolled in a course at CSU within two years or more, but left in good standing, are required to complete a readmit form. A fee is not required with this form. Admitted students who have not attended CSU within the last two years must obtain a departmental advisor's signature. Submit your extension registration form, at-large application or readmit form, proof of degree, tuition fee and a \$25 at-large application fee to your instructor or an extension services department representative on the first day of the class, or submit to the extension services department on campus (JDC 201), if enrolling only in extension courses.

ORAL ENGLISH PROFICIENCY Student Complaint Procedures

Approved September, 1991

Illinois statute requires each public institution of higher education to "establish a program to assess the oral English language proficiency of all persons providing classroom instruction to students," and to "ensure that each person who is not orally proficient in the English language attain such proficiency prior to providing any classroom instruction to students."

Students with complaints about the oral English proficiency of Chicago State faculty should first contact the chairperson of the department involved. The complaint must be in writing and should be as specific as possible. Copies of the complaint must be sent to the appropriate college dean and to the provost/vice president for academic affairs.

The chairperson will investigate the complaint and may observe the class. If the chairperson concludes that the faculty member's English is adequate, the chairperson will notify the student, the faculty member, the dean, and the provost/vice president for academic affairs. The student may appeal the chairperson's decision to the dean. The dean will then investigate the complaint and follow the same notification procedure. The decision of the dean will be final.

If the chairperson or the dean finds that the faculty member's oral English is unsatisfactory, he or she will make a recommendation to the provost/vice president for academic affairs. The provost will take action on this recommendation and notify all parties involved of his or her decision.

Except for the necessary notifications, the identities of all students and faculty involved in oral English proficiency complaints shall remain confidential.
