## Moodle 2.6.3 is Here

Chicago State University recently  
upgraded to the latest stable version  
of Moodle (2.6.3).

This version offers some exciting  
new features while preserving the  
overall user interface that faculty and  
students have grown accustomed to.  
Unlike the substantial upgrade to  
version 2.4 in fall 2013, this change is  
more incremental, and will be no-  
ticed in subtler ways.

## OCT Begins 6/30

The next section of Online Certification Training (OCT) will begin on June 30.

OCT is an eight-week online course designed to help prepare faculty to teach in an online setting. The following units are covered:

- What is Online Teaching?
- Best Practices
- Copyright and Fair Use
- ADA Web Accessibility
- Instructional Design Basics
- Building Course Content

Those who enroll in OCT can expect to spend approximately 3-5 hours per week with readings and assignments, which will include quizzes, discussion forums, and projects. All work must be completed in order to pass OCT.

For the final project for OCT, participants will be required to complete two full modules of content for an online course.
