

right on your desk (or desktop).


Looking Forward

Dr. Debrah Jefferson,

Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs and Contract Administration, came to talk about the CSU contract, the tenure process, and retention portfolio requirements. Speaking from the ground floor, Dr. Jefferson was able to answer questions

and give advice for both the long and short term.

Also in attendance were **Drs. Esther Jenkins, Virginia Shen, and Elizabeth Arnott-Hill**, who were present to provide new faculty with their perspec-

tives on how to navigate the waters of teaching, research, and fulfilling professional requirements. It was an informal atmos-

phere, affording everyone a chance to ask questions big and small about the issues that new faculty face—which can seem like an overwhelming list, especially when starting a new semester.

But many of the questions, it should be noted, were relevant to all facul-
