ney to provide assistance in negotiating a textbook contract. Hiring such an attorney can help first-time authors negotiate the most favorable terms on publishing agreements.

TAA members can apply for grants up to \$1,000; non-members can apply for grants up

to first-time textbook authors who have been offered a publishing contract.

TAA recommends hiring an intellectual property

Openness in Education MOOC

For those interested in learning more about Open Educational Resources (OER) in a structured, collaborative setting, consider taking **Openness in Education**.

Openness in Education is a free Massive Open Online Course (MOOC), hosted by Athabasca University. Over the course of twelve weeks, it will define and explore OER, and discuss its implications, possible uses, and foreseen expansion in education.

Openness in Education will look at how resources such as blogs, Twitter, wikis, Google Docs, YouTube, Diigo, and concept

mapping software can be used to engage students with OER.
