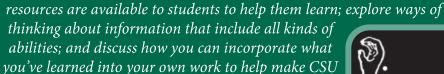
Looking Forward

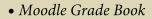

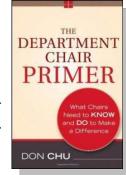
