



Preceptor Reminder: Student Evaluations Due by Monday, May 4, 2009!

As a reminder, during the week of April 27, 2009, preceptors should complete the final "Professional Practice II Practicum Competency Evaluation" form and discuss it with the student. Preceptors should submit the "Professional Practice II Practicum Competency Evaluation" via EMS (Education Management System) by **Monday, May 4, 2009**.

To successfully achieve a passing grade for the practicum, the student must achieve at least "Satisfactory" for **ALL** learning objectives. The last site visit will be on Tuesday, April 28, 2009 (for students enrolled in Tuesday section) or Thursday, April 30, 2009 (for students enrolled in the Thursday section).

Additionally, preceptors must certify that students have attended all practicum site visits as scheduled. After the student has entered their practicum hours within EMS, preceptors should verify the hours within EMS via the "Verification of Hours" form by **Monday, May 4, 2009**.

To access the forms in EMS, visit <https://www2.ems-webs.com/ChicagoSt/>. EMS may also be accessed from the CSU-COP web page: <http://www.csu.edu/collegeofpharmacy/experientialeducation/index.htm>. To log into EMS, your User ID is your first name.last name (ex. Charisse.Johnson).

After logging into EMS, choose "Rotations" from the left side menu bar, and then "Evaluations." Complete the "Professional Practice II Practicum Competency Evaluation" and "Verification of Hours" forms for the student(s). Follow the directions provided within each form.
