Bachelor of Science in Recreation

Moraine Valley Community College and Chicago State University have agreed to develop this articulation agreement to enhance opportunities for students from Moraine Valley Community College to transfer to Chicago State University in the Recreation Major.


The two institutions agree to the following:

1. Students should complete a certificate or A.A.S. degree at Moraine Valley as indicated in this agreement
2. The MVCC courses listed in this agreement have been reviewed and accepted for transfer to Chicago State University.
3. In addition to the courses required for the certificate or A.A.S. degree at Moraine Valley as indicated in this agreement, students may also complete prescribed bridge courses at Moraine Valley prior to admission to Chicago State University.
4. Courses to be completed at Chicago State University for completion of the baccalaureate degree are indicated in this agreement
5. Each institution will provide the cooperating institution appropriate prior notice of any curriculum changes.
6. Both institutions will approve publications and promotional materials about this agreement
7. Either institution may dissolve this agreement by giving one year's advance notice to the cooperating institution.
8. Communication regarding this agreement will be coordinated through the identified institutional contacts.
9. This agreement is effective with the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 academic years.




