Four students submitted work for the 1st Portfolio Review; three passed and one failed.

Seven students participated in the 2nd Portfolio Review; five passed and two failed.

Four students took the Senior Portfolio Review and all passed.

Overall students performed well. All students who failed did so in the Art/Design paper category. The weaknesses still remain in the quality of writing – grammar, failing to proof, no citation, no bibliography, incomplete papers and incoherent writing. With a full implementation of Seminar I, II, and III courses into the curriculum, it is foreseen that the problem in these areas will be reduced.

The amount of artwork created and the lack of creation/presentation backed up with art and related theories are additional concerns that the faculty members have. Embedding more theory-based projects and emphasizing the assignments outside the class in all required courses seems to be needed.

Also, students often do not have works (art/design paper, drawing, and 2D design) ready early enough for the 1<sup>st</sup> assessment. To ensure students' readiness for it, embedding the 1<sup>st</sup> department assessment into Seminar III seems to be necessary.

The following changes and improvements will continue to be done or addressed during Fall 2011 – Spring 2012 academic year.

- Seminar courses will continue to provide clearer directions and practical help in order to assist students in improving their writing skills.
- Developing the following materials and web pages in the department website: the assessment report, student testimonials, and student artworks to inform internal/external stakeholders about the assessment outcomes.
- Analyzing reflective student self-assessment exit interviews gathered to date upon graduation.

- All Assessment forms will be revised and updated. More categories will be added to assure that all materials turn-in for the Senior Portfolio can be appropriately evaluated. This will allow for clearer and more accurate results.
- Faculty felt that the Senior Portfolio Culmination paper lacked the research and critical thinking of one's work. The Senior Portfolio syllabus and assignments need to be revisited to assure that the course is taught with the department's goals in mind.
- A Moodle Course will be created which will contain all department Assessment materials. Student papers will be uploaded to this course shell to give better access for faculty to read, comment and evaluate. Faculty will also submit final evaluation results through the course shell. This will allow compiling the results more quickly and more accurately. It will also make it easier for faculty to access materials when needed.
- Dividing Senior Portfolio into two semesters. The first semester would be devoted to developing the research and written portion of the course. Such as proposal of work, artist statement, resume, cover letter, and business cards. Curricular action to add this course and change program requirements must take place in Fall 2011. Implementation of requirement would apply for entry year Fall 2012.
- Prior to Senior Portfolio require students to chose and register for an Independent Study with advisor in the chosen area. Independent Study would prepare students to identify and propose project that would be executed during Senior Portfolio.
- Inviting art students to attend 2<sup>nd</sup> Assessment presentations.

### **Accomplishments and Challenges**

- Provided specific art major statements, art papers, and artist statement in Seminar courses as well as the department assessment website to aid students.
- There was a juried student exhibition in the President's Gallery. There was also a pin up as part of the Art Talent Scholarship application. With these additional exhibitions, students are better understanding how to select and present their work for their assessment portfolios and exhibitions.
- The Department now has an exit survey for seniors.
- To ensure that students have work ready for the 1<sup>st</sup> department assessment, the Assessment coordinator will hold a workshop/signup session during the 4th week of the semester in Seminar III.
- Students that are ready for 1<sup>st</sup> Assessment will be contacted and a meeting will be held the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of the semester. This will allow students to prepare for the workshop held during the 4<sup>th</sup> week of the semester.
- Students are required to electronically submit written work. Faculty has the option to submit Assessment results electronically.
- On the 1<sup>st</sup> Assessment requirement handout the following changes were made: matting work is no longer required, and Seminar I and II course numbers were collected.
- On the 2<sup>nd</sup> Assessment requirement handout the number or required work was changed to 15 required pieces, bibliography and citations are required with the paper and course numbers were changed to Design option, Multimedia and Studio Art.
- Assistant provided a Writing Workshop for students in Spring semester. Six Art students attended this workshop. Students were tutored throughout the semester.
- Students who have passed required department courses must attempt 1<sup>st</sup> Assessment in order to be considered for the Art Scholarship.

## **Attachment 1**

### **Method of Assessment**

For the 1<sup>st</sup> Portfolio Review that is directed towards sophomores, students are required to submit a portfolio of required studio course work, an art major statement and two art history/art/design papers. This is administered in the 6<sup>th</sup> week of each semester.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Portfolio Review, for juniors, requires a portfolio of specific studio course work, a paper, an artist statement and a short oral presentation. This is administered in the 11<sup>th</sup> week of each semester.

The Senior Portfolio Review, part of the department's capstone course, is set up as an exhibition with an oral presentation. An artist statement, resume, culmination piece and culmination paper are also required. This review is now being held only at the end of the spring semester.

These assessments are all performance based. All tenured and tenure-track faculty are required by our bylaws to participate in the assessment process by grading the portfolios and the oral presentations.
