Admission Requirements:

Meet the general admission requirements of the University and be enrolled as a pre-community health major. Attain and maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. After completion of the pre-requisite courses, students must apply to the Community Health Professional Program. Complete an application to include a personal essay, typewritten on a separate sheet, describing the factors that influenced their decision to enter the community health field, and their professional aspirations following completion of the program, and submit one letter of recommendation in a sealed envelope.

Job Outlook:

Graduates of the community health program enter the job market as health educators, fitness consultants, consumer information directors, and community outreach coordinators who are trained to promote healthy lifestyles through behavior modification. Student learning outcomes in Community Health following completion of the Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in community health, the graduates will:

- Promote health and prevent disease by positively influencing the behavior of clients.
- Determine individual and community health needs by using valid health information and appropriate evaluative methods.
- Understand the US health care system and respond ethically to health care disparities.
- Comprehend published research in public health.
