"Discussion Between Health Care Providers and Patients related to Prostate Specific Antigen Testing: Evidence from the USA"

Dr. Kumar Mukherjee 12:00 - 2:00 /LIB 301

The objectives of this study were to explore a) the effect of socio-demographic and personal characteristics on extent of discussions between men and healthcare providers about prostate specific antigen (PSA) testing and b) the effect of discussions on PSA testing. This retrospective cross-sectional study analyzed data collected from the 2012 wave of the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). A discussion (three levels: complete, partial, none) with healthcare providers about PSA testing was considered as a dependent variable. Baseline category logistic model was used.

E-Book Collection

The CSU library offers a number of e-book collections available to students, staff, and faculty from various vendors. Some e-books are accessible by one person at a time, meaning that if someone is using a particular e-book you will not be able to do so until the e-book is "returned" or no longer being accessed, and other e-books are multi-user, more than one person can view and download it at a time. This column introduces four vendors and briefly discusses how to read these e-books online and download them to a device.

ACCESS:


- In order to access CSU's e-book collections, you must start at the library's site: http://library.csu.edu
- In the search box, select the "E-books" tab, and once there, you will be faced with two options.

Option 1:

You may look for e-books by typing in a topic or title in the search box, and from there, you will be taken to the library catalog.

Option 2:

The second option is more complicated, but more extensive, and can provide you with more up-to-date results, as the vendor databases are more frequently updated. Option 2 involves searching for a topic or title in each native vendor database instead of just the library catalog. This means conducting the same search in several database interfaces.




E-books may be viewed online via a browser or they may also be downloaded for a specified loan period to computers or mobile devices.



In order to access the e-book, you will be asked to enter your Cougar Connect information and select Chicago State University from a list of institutions:



 Once you provide this information, you will have access to the title.

To View Online:

 Click on the "Read Online" button on the left:



To Download:

• Click on the "Read Online" button, and you will be taken to the e-book, where new options will appear, one of which is "Download." When you click on the "Download" option, you will be given the chance to download the e-book for 7 days to your computer:

To View Online:


 First search for the book, and then click on the book's title or on the "PDF Full Text" link:



 Once you do so, you will obtain full access to the book, unless it is a one-user copy and has already been downloaded for 7 days or is being read by someone online at the same time.

To Download:

- EBSCOhost allows 7 days downloads or "checkouts" of e-books.
- Click on the "Download" link to download the e-book.
- You will be promoted to create or login to your account, and once you do so, the book will download to your account and/or device of your choosing.



To View Online and/or Download:


 Search or Browse for ebrary titles, and click on the title of the e-book to obtain more options.



Library and Instruction Services News (cont'd)



- Once you are in the e-book record, you will find options to read the title online or to download it.
- To download, you will have to take the additional step of creating or logging into an ebrary account:



If you elect to download the ebooks, and click on the download button, you will be prompted to create an account. (It will take a few mins. to create one.)

Once you create it, you will be able to download ebooks to your account and your device(s) for 7 days.

Online Teaching Excellence: Assessment Begins March 1, 2015

Chicago State University's Center for Teaching and Research Excellence (CTRE) pilot of Online Teaching Excellence:
Assessment begins March 1, 2015 and over five weeks, we will be exploring assessment from a variety of angles, which will ultimately help individuals plan their classes more effectively and collect more meaningful evidence of student learning.

By enhancing the participants understanding of assessment, they will be able to:

- clearly identify what assessment is and recognize its importance as an educative tool
- differentiate various forms of assessment and know what each is used for
- assess for varying degrees of breadth and depth of understanding
- create and implement rubrics as tools of student learning and assessment

This course will help participants to not only understand important educational concepts on a theoretical level, but also how to rigorously implement them in their own teaching.

This course is **completely online**, and focuses on a variety of concepts and general best practices in assessment, which you will then be able to apply to courses, be they face-to-face, hybrid, or online. Although the forms that assessment can take may differ depending on the format of the class, there are some fundamental concepts and practices that are employed regardless. We will be focusing on those throughout this course.

Although this course will proceed in an **asynchronous** fashion (i.e., participants can participate as their schedule allows), participants are welcome to request online meetings that are **synchronous** (i.e., occurring at the same time).

If they successfully meet all of the requirements for this course, they will receive a certificate of completion from the CTRE signed by the Dean of Library and Instruction Services and the CSU Provost.

The work for this course will include readings, media, assignments, discussion forums, and quizzes. In order to receive your certificate, participants must do the following:

- Complete all assignments
- Submit substantial posts to discussion forums
- Complete all quizzes

This pilot course will be co-facilitated by Jacqueline Callery, EdD, and Michael Sukowski, MEd.
