The next round of CTRE grant applications is due by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, December 15.

The CTRE has a total of approximately \$60,000.00 to be used to support the following:

Faculty Development Stipend

Maximum Amounts:

- Attending conference: \$1,500
- Presenting at a conference: \$3,000
- Equipment/supplies: \$5,000

<u>Faculty Development Award—Student</u> Engagement

Maximum Amount: \$10,000

Faculty Development Seed Grant

Maximum Amount: \$15,000

As of November 25, the CTRE has received



15 applications.

Each application is assessed according to a grant-specific rubric, which can be found on the CTRE website's **Grants** page. The website also contains application forms and additional guidelines.

To make a request:

- 1) Go to the CSU Library website at library.csu.edu
- 2) Under the **Information For** section, click on **Faculty**
- 3) Once the new page opens, click on the **Request New Library Material Form** link located on the left-hand side.

"Illinois Principals' Perceptions and Expectations of Students Who Speak African American Vernacular English (Ebonics)"

Faculty Symposium Series with Dr. Garrard McClendon

This study investigates Illinois Public School principals' individual and aggregate perceptions of and expectations for students who use African American Vernacular English. Using the African American English Teacher Attitude Scale (AAETAS), the study describes the relationship between principals' demographic characteristics and their perceptions of African American Vernacular English.

"Novel Triclosan Analogues are Active Against Tuberculosis and Toxoplasmosis"

Faculty Symposium Series with Dr.

Jozef Stec

This presentation will discuss rational design, synthesis and biological evaluation of novel triclosan (TRC) analogues as agents active against Mycobacterium tuberculosis and Toxoplasma gondii - the causative agents of tuberculosis and toxoplasmosis, respectively. Several molecules in the prepared focused library of compounds showed high in vitro inhibitory activity by targeting the bacterial FabI enzyme which is crucial for the biosynthesis of bacterial fatty acids.
