CTRE Online Training Courses

With the semester coming to a close, consider taking one of the CTRE's online training courses.

Online Certification Training (OCT) is an eight-week, completely virtual course designed to prepare CSU faculty to teach in an online setting. It assumes only a basic level of proficiency with technology, and helps participants gain both a theoretical and practical understanding of online teaching. The following units are covered:

• What is Online Teaching?

- Best Practices
- ADA Web Accessibility
- Copyright, Fair Use, and the TEACH Act
- Instructional Design Basics
- Building Course Content
- Course Modules

# What's Your Back-Up Plan?

Imagine the following Live logs from the past hour familiar scenario:

The end of the semester is approaching, and you are worried for the students in your online course. *Many of them have* failed to turn in some major assignments, despite frequent reminders from you. Then suddenly, with just a few days before

finals, three students come to you pleading about their grades. They all claim to have submitted all of their assignments to you, and that you must have lost them or Moodle must not be working. How can you know if they are telling the truth?

Fortunately, Moodle has a feature that allows instructors to see reports of student activity, including when stu-

- Activity completion

Each report can be customized for a variety of parameters, allowing you to find information for specific students, activities, timeframes, and more.

For instructors who have already completed OCT but would like to continue building their online teaching skills, there is an additional online course that the CTRE offers, called Online Teaching Excellence: Pedagogy and Andragogy. This course is split into a two-course sequence, each one lasting four weeks. The first four weeks, (OTE I) covers the following teaching theory concepts:

- What is Pedagogy?

### An Introduction to Two LibGuides

This month's column will introduce the following two LibGuides: ENG 1280: English Composition II created by Prof. Charlene Snelling, the Chicago State University Library Reference & Instruction Coordinator, and Management 4850 52: International Business created by Prof. Rosalind Fielder, the Chicago State University Library Reference and Instruction Librarian.

#### ENG 1280: English Composition II

This guide was prepared for library instruction sessions for students enrolled in English 1280. The guide is based on the work of many librarians within the Libguides community, including librarians at Chicago State University. You may find the library guide <u>Student Information about the Library and Research</u> very useful as well.

To access ENG 1280: English Composition II guide:

- 1) From Library Web site (<u>library.csu.edu</u>) click on Research/Subject Guides
- 2) Click on LibGuides@csu.edu
- 3) On the alphabetic list of the LibGuides click on <u>Course</u> Guides
- 4) Click on ENG 1280: English Composition II

This LibGuide contains the following pages:

#### Page 1 (Home)

An overview of the guide and what you are expected to learn from the guide.

#### Page 2 (Evaluate Sources)

Highlights the CRAAP (Currency, Relevance, Authority, Accuracy, Purpose) test that will help you to evaluate video sources, and a tutorial called "Avoiding Wikipedia."

#### Page 3 (Topic Searching)

Includes information on keywords and key concepts; keyword search rules including Boolean Search Operators; "phrase search" and truncation. Also includes in-class exercises and an opportunity to identify keywords from the Illinois Math and Science Academy and develop your skill.

#### Page 4 (Online Reference resources)

Highlights CSU Library major online resources Credo



Reference Search; Credo Reference Books by Subject; Gale Virtual Library; Britannica Online; Oxford English Dictionary and a tutorial called "Selecting a Topic."

#### Page 5 (Article Databases)

Highlights three primary ways to accessing CSU library databases, three multidisciplinary databases, two issue-oriented article database, and four news article sources. The page also includes how to access and search CSU library databases off-campus.

#### Page 6 (Library Catalogs)

Includes CSU Library Catalog and <u>I-Share Catalog</u>; a <u>List of I-Share Libraries</u>; and how to open an <u>I-Share User Account</u>.

#### Page 7 (Cite Sources)

Includes four APA citation style resources, three MLA citation style information, and two Chicago/Turabian citation style information. Also includes a tutorial called "Avoiding Plagiarism."

#### Management 4850.52: International Business

This guide was prepared for students enrolled in Management 4850.52. The Chicago State University Library has a variety of resources that are useful for research related to business administration, including international business. The resources listed are representative not exhaustive. This guide benefits from the work of


