Below is an important message from Program enrichment: \$4,000.00 the Director of the CTRE, Mr. Michael Sukowski, regarding the most recent grant application submission period:

Hello dear colleagues,

CTRE grant applications continue to increase in number of applications and dollar amounts re-

quested. In grant applications for the first quarter (July 1, 2014) we have received the following:

Faculty development/travel: \$54,319.95

Student engagement: \$19,585.00 Seed grant/research: \$71,400.00

TOTAL \$149,304.95

Dividing our budget by four quarters, we have a total of \$67,250.00 available

for all grant categories this first quarter, well below the total amount requested. The faculty advisory committee's review subcommittee has a daunting task ahead of them.

Applications received after the 5:00pm July 1 deadline cannot be considered this round. First-time applicants should receive first consideration, other applications for future travel (after September 1st) will be considered for the September round.

Respondus LockDown Browser & Monitor

Chicago State University now has an institutional license to use Respondus LockDown Browser and Respondus Monitor. Both of these applications allow for greater security in internet test-taking.

LockDown Browser is a custom internet browser that students must download before taking an exam in Moodle. When it is engaged, students cannot access other webpages, copy and paste, screen capture, or right-click on any thing.



Respondus Monitor captures a live video stream of students via a webcam while they are taking an exam. You can then review the video afterwards.
