Chicago State University

Principal Preparation-Principal Endorsement Overview

On May 7th, 2013, the Illinois State Educator Licensure and Preparation Board (SELPB) approved Chicago State University's new program to prepare transformational urban school leaders, which will be governed in a partnership with several school districts and schools. This endorsement is required for principals, assistant principals, and staff filling other similar or related positions. Applicants to the endorsement shall

- Have an earned Bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited college or university;
- Have three (3) years of teaching in a public school or nonpublic school recognized by the State Board of Education under a valid and current Illinois professional educator license endorsed in a teaching field (i.e., early childhood, elementary, secondary, special K-12, or special preschool-age 21);
- Have passed the Illinois Basic Skills test;
- Submit two (2) letters of recommendations from direct supervisors; and
- Submit an electronic portfolio highlighting their accomplishments as teachers.

- ELCF 5345 Internship 1 (2 credits)—Prerequisite: Passing the Training in Evaluation of Certified Staff
- ELCF 5346 Internship II (2 credits)
- ELCF 5347 Internship III (2 credits)—Prerequisite: Passing Illinois Licensure Tests for Principals

The coursework is aligned to the Interstate School Leader Licensure Consortium (ISLLC) standards, Illinois Professional Teaching Standards, and Illinois Performance Standards for School Leaders.

*Internship will be conducted over three (3) semesters. During each of the three (3) semesters candidates will spend a minimum of six (6) hours per week on internship activities, under the direct supervision of selected principal mentors and faculty supervisors.
