## PRE-OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY MAJORS COMBINED BS/MOT PROGRAM



## College of Health Sciences

The Department of Occupational Therapy offers a combined Bachelor of Health Sciences (BHS) Pre-Occupational Therapy degree, which is a pre-professional degree designed to prepare students to enter the Master of Occupational Therapy (MOT) program at Chicago State University. The combined BHS/MOT curriculum allows students to enter the professional phase of the occupational therapy program as undergraduates (in their senior year) and supports the transition to a post-baccalaureate degree (MOT) in occupational therapy.

To become a Pre-Occupational Therapy major, students must apply to and meet the university's general admission requirements and officially declare Health Sciences: Pre-Occupational Therapy as a major. Admission to the professional phase of the program (BHS/MOT program) is a competitive process based on completing the course requirements listed below and acceptance by the Occupational Therapy Admissions Committee. To be considered for acceptance to the BHS/MOT program, applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (for all CSU and accepted non-CSU courses) and a GPA of 3.0 for the nine required OT course prerequisites (anthropology or sociology, statistics, developmental psychology, abnormal psychology, medical terminology, human anatomy, human physiology, cadaver lab, and introduction to occupational therapy).
