

LOCATION: Our location in the nation's third-largest city offers CSU students a myriad of personal and professional possibilities, including: access to 26 miles of lakefront, major-league sports, renowned museums, theaters, and festivals, plus our famous architecture; easy transit connections for exploring our 77 diverse neighborhoods and traveling to major employers.

ACADEMIC ADVISING: Upon admission to the university, students are assigned academic advisors in their major fields of study. In most academic departments or programs, the advisors are regular faculty members. Students must meet with their academic advisors at least once each term for advisement prior to registration.

ATHLETICS: As an NCAA Division I institution, Chicago State University is committed to student-athlete success. Athletes are fully prepared for personal and professional success before and after graduation

CAMPUS SAFETY: The Chicago State University Police Department maintains a safe and secure campus environment. Members of the Department are trained professionals who present a uniformed presence while serving the University Community. Crime occurrences are virtually non-existent on campus. CAREER SERVICES: The Career Development Center at the Chicago State University prepares students to leverage their academic and leadership experiences through individualized support and access to employer partnerships. **FACULTY:** 100% of CSU courses are taught directly by our faculty and 70% are faculty of color, setting the standard for diversity.*

HOUSING: The Chicago State University Resident Hall strives to offer the most engaging residential experience enriched with diverse living and learning opportunities that foster academic growth. Our residential community is housed in a three-story coeducational facility that houses approximately 300 new friends in over 140 double rooms with suite style living.

SMALL CLASSES: CSU class sizes are small, giving students ample access to interact with faculty. In 2023, our faculty to student ratio was 1:10.

STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS: Chicago State University offers a wide variety of

ways for our students to make connections: clubs and organizations, intramurals, student government, annual events, fraternities and sororities, performing arts productions and much more!

TRANSPORTATION: CSU provides easy access to other areas in Chicago via two CTA bus lines that leave directly from campus, and the CTA red-line subway, which accessible using the campus shuttle. The campus also has a Metra stop on the Metra Electric line that goes directly downtown.

TECHNOLOGY: The Information Technology Division (ITD) powers the university with best in class and most cost effective and efficient technology.
