

 Illinois' higher education and workforce systems are failing Black students. Between 2013 and 2018, postsecondary enrollment for Black Illinoisans dropped 29.2%, indicating a crisis for Illinois and its Black students.

To address equity gaps that exist for Black students from high school graduation through entry in the workforce, over 40 Illinois leaders representing secondary and postsecondary education, elected officials, government agencies, business, community-

based organizations, and philanthropy formed the Equity Working Group for Black Student Access and Success in Illinois Higher Education.

 postsecondary, and even fewer will secure a job that pays an equitable wage after
